My dear Mr. Squires:


As you probably have observed in correspondence concerning the important call by Director Davis of the United States Reclamation Service, this meeting will not be held on July 28th, but on August 3rd at San Diego. Am glad that you and Dr. Martin will be present. I have been informed by Col. J. G. Scrugham, State Engineer, that he will be present.

In order that League members may easily maintain access we have designated the San Diego Hotel as League headquarters. I would suggest that you either write me, or directly to the San Diego Hotel and make such reservations as you require.

If you happen to get into Los Angeles with some time to spare I suggest that you call on me at the Hotel Ingraham. This hotel is two blocks West of Figueroa and one block North of Seventh Street. You take the Seventh Street car and get off at Bixel and walk one block North on Bixel. I will in all likelihood be at the hotel because my health keeps me confined closely to its precincts. I expect, however, to be at San Diego. I think I may leave here on the 1st of August.
