

N.P.S. Museum Now Open Daily, Exhibits Show Plants, Animals of Area

The National Park service has reopened its museum, which has been closed since March 1943. It is now located in the N. P. S. building on New Mexico street at Avenue F, seven days a week.

All exhibits are on display as before the war, with a few new ones, showing geology, biology, and archeology of the area.

There is a large relief map of the Boulder dam and Lake Mead area.

There are displays of mammals, reptiles, insects, including a complete exhibit of the giant prehistoric ground sloth of this region.

There are exhibits of pre-historic Indians, birds and flowers.

One case contains explanations of the geology of Grand Canyon, another, rocks and minerals of the area, especially around Boulder dam.
