

New Boulder Weekly Due

BOULDER CITY, Oct. 27 — A new publication, "The Boulder City Reporter," will be circulated here Saturday evening, reportedly for the purpose of counteracting unfavorable criticism of the local schools by the community's only newspaper, the weekly Boulder City News.

It has been widely charged that the criticism has been dictated by "personal animosity" on the part of the News publisher, Morry Zenoff, against members of the school board.

Sponsored by a group of businessmen, The Reporter will be edited by Gene Segerblom, local freelance writer, with Alton Roueche, grocery store manager, as business manager.

It will be constructive in tone, according to Roueche with community, school and sports news

by local newspaper correspondents, and editorial comment by Mrs. Segerblom. All work is being done voluntarily in a spirit of community service, he said, with advertisers paying the cost of printing and surplus funds to be donated to the community ambulance project.

Timed to appear before the general election next Tuesday, The Reporter will call attention to the accomplishments of the incumbent school board, two members of which, L. R. Douglass and D. D. Dutter, are up for reelection, both with opposition.
