

Harold Smart Retiring

As Long Time Officer

BOULDER CITY — Harold A. Smart, realty officer in the Bureau of Reclamation's Region 3, Division of Irrigation, has retired with more than 22 years of federal service, Regional Director A. B. West announced yesterday.

A native of Helena, Okla., Smart came to Boulder City April 17, 1945, as an engineer on the Region 3 staff, and the following year was named assistant regional land officer in the Land Acquisition Division. As Reclamation's principal realty and appraisal officer in the Pacific Southwest, he had handled rights-of-way acquisitions for dams, transmission lines, canals, and other water resources projects.

After leaving school in 1922 he accepted a position with the city engineer of Wichita, Kansas, working there until late in 1928. He held various other positions prior to his government service.
