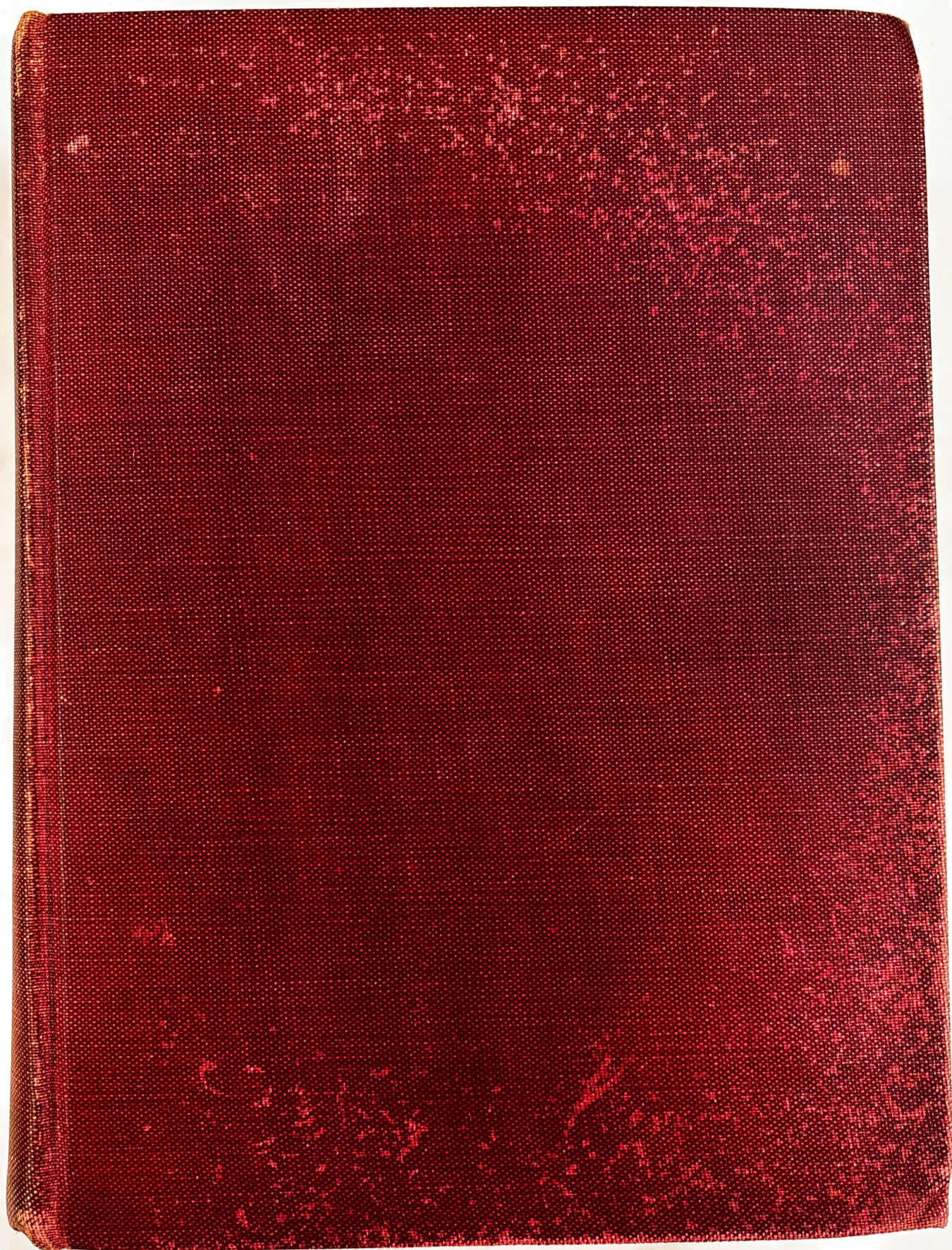

BOULDER CITY

This survey of Boulder City was made in partial fulfillment of the degree **A Survey of Its Legal Background, Its City Plan and Its Administration** at Syracuse University.

Boulder City is in northwestern Nevada, about seven miles from the site of the Hoover Dam. It is a planned city constructed on desert wastes by the Federal Government for use as a construction camp by those employed in erecting the dam structure. At the time of the survey it had a population of approximately 7,500.

The original idea of Ray L. Wilbur, Jr. the survey of Boulder City was to make a A.B., Stanford University, 1933 municipal development. Added to that was the incentive to put on paper some description of the unique administration of many services by the city manager, that day. The possibilities for a proper thesis subject offered the relating of unusual experiences and the only attempt yet made to write a complete history of Boulder City.
