

HOUSES COSTING AS LOW AS \$250 MAY BE BUILT, PROVIDED PAINT, PLUMBING REQUIREMENTS ARE MET

Ground Space Will Be Leased in Zones, Lease Rates Varying From \$2.50 to \$6.00 a Month; Frame Construction Admissible, But No "Paper Shacks"

Paving the way to increased building of privately owned homes in Boulder City, bureau of reclamation officials have released information showing where homes, costing at varying sums from \$250 upward, can be built on lots to be leased at nominal amounts from the government.

Having zoned the remaining residential section, which is now available for building, the bureau of reclamation promises builders and prospective builders there will be no placing of \$250 houses next door to homes costing \$1,000.

Lease prices for lots range from \$2.50 to \$6 a month, and there are at least 90 sites available aside from those on which Six Companies Inc. and the government are constructing homes for their employes.

THE RESIDENTIAL districts for those not employed by the government or the contractors lies on the east side of town, to the south of the hospital.

Snell Suffers Severe Accident
