

W. L. KENDRICK TO LEAVE MANGANESE, INC.

On Friday afternoon announcement was made that W. L. Kendrick, Vice President and General Manager of Manganese, Inc. is being transferred by Howe Sound Company, the parent company, to take over the management of the Tungsten Mining Corporation at Henderson, North Carolina.

Mr. Kendrick came to Manganese, Inc. as Kiln Superintendent on June 1, 1954. He was promoted to Ass't. General Superintendent on July 1, 1956, to General Superintendent on March 1, 1957 and to his present position on October 13, 1957.
