Dave Armstrong, Pioneer Boulder City Resident, Dies

Dave Armstrong, pioneer resident of Boulder City and an employe of the bureau of reclamation since 1918, died at his home, 1350 Denver, this morning after a sudden heart attack, it was reported.

Armstrong was one of the first residents of Boulder City and his home in the community was among the first to be constructed there. He had been on the Boulder Canyon project since 1930, first residing in Las Vegas and then moving to Boulder City

when the town was finished. He first went to work for the bureau in 1918 when he was with the King Hill, Idaho project.

Armstrong was born on January 9, 1882 and is survived by his widow, Clara, of Boulder City; one daughter, Nancy L. Forderman, of Cory, Indiana; a brother, Joseph, of Cory and a sister, Linda Lee Warner, of Se-wanee, Tennessee.

Armstrong underwent surgery about a month ago and appeared to be improving steadily. He was taken home about 10 days ago and was able to be up and around. However, this morning, he suffered a heart attack and died before medical attention could be summoned.

Remains are at Bunker Brothers where funeral services are pending.
