

# Bob Pickard Funeral To Be Held Thursday, War Casualty Returned

Bob Pickard, who was killed in action early in the war in New Guinea, will be laid to rest in San Bruno, Calif., Thursday of this week after funeral services held there, and attended by relatives from Nevada and Colorado.

The body of Pickard, who was employed both at Boulder City and Henderson before he went into the service near the start of hostilities, has been returned to this country from its first resting place in the South Pacific.

Mrs. Harry Fuller of Boulder City, George Pickard of Henderson and Mrs. Tom Strawn of Davis Dam, sisters and brother of Pickard, left southern Nevada Sunday together to attend the funeral.

Mrs. Catherine Pickard of Boulder, Colo., mother of the four, also plans to attend the services.

Bob Pickard was employed by the Bureau of Reclamation and later the Bureau of Mines in Boulder City, then as electrician at Henderson during construction of the B.M.I. plant. He was a technical sergeant in the U. S. army signal corps when he was killed. BCN Wed 14 July 1948
