

Masonic Services Set Thursday For Bill Russell, Boulder Photographer

BOULDER CITY, May 14. — William Sidney (Bill) Russell, 48, Bureau of Reclamation photographer here for the past 10 years, died at his home 713 Arizona, at 1:30 this morning of a heart attack. His sudden death was a shock to the community where the family has a wide circle of friends. He had been back at work after a recent illness and had been out Sunday taking official pictures of an important visiting group from Afghanistan.

Masonic funeral rites will be held in the temple here at 2 p.m. Thursday, and the remains will be sent to Spokane, Wash. for burial in the family plot. Russell was born in Spokane, Mar. 7, 1903, the son of Mr. and Mrs.
