

Military Funeral Today for Bob Sheridan

A military funeral will be held this afternoon for Robert Sheridan at the Boulder City cemetery, under auspices of the Boulder City American Legion post, of which he was a member for the past five years.

Lee Pickett, commander of the post, will be in charge, with firing squad and bugler from the Las Vegas Army air field assisting in the service.

Pallbearers will be friends of Sheridan's at the Bureau of Mines and from the Bureau of Reclamation ranger force, with which he formerly served:

E. Paul Carter, L. R. Chase, Sgt. George Franklin, Sgt. Perlie Morris, Sgt. Roy Patrick and Ranger Ellsworth Holmes.

Veterans will gather at the K.P. hall at 4:30 to go to the cemetery in a body for the service.

Sheridan died Monday night at the Clark county hospital, having suffered a heart ailment.

Sheridan served in World War I, and was at that time athletic director at various camps. He had made a reputation as a distance swimmer and as a middleweight boxer.

He was at one time instructor
