# Final Rites Held for P. S. (Jim) Webb

Final rites for Paul S. (Jim) Webb, 63-year-old pioneer Boulder City resident, were held Monday morning at the Cathedral Chapel in Los Angeles with many Boulder City friends and former associates in attendance. Burial was in the family plot in the Holy Cross Cemetery in Los Angeles.

Mr. Webb died Oct. 4 at the Wadsworth General Hospital in Los Angeles where he had been confined for treatment for several weeks.
