

Boulder, Lake Mead Area Proposed for "World Capital" of U. N. by C. C.

If the United Nations delegates become deadlocked in a battle over which of the four proposed sites to use for the "world capital," they can do even better by compromising on the Boulder, Lake Mead area.

This suggestion was wired by a Boulder City chamber of commerce committee last night to Pres. Harry Truman, Secretary of State James Byrnes, the U. N. permanent home site committee, Secretary of the Interior Julius Krug, Sen. Pat McCarran, Senator-elect George Malone, Congressman-elect Charles Russell, Gov. Vail Pittman of Nevada, Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt, U. S. A. representative with U. N., and others.

The committee, of which Harold Julian is chairman, met at the Green Hut last evening and drafted the wire, which was also sent to Bing and Everett Crosby, Pres. Jack Frye of TWA, and others.

This action was sanctioned at Friday's chamber, after Mrs. Julian had presented her husband's idea.
