

INTERNATIONAL AND INTERSTATE ASPECTS OF THE COLORADO RIVER PROBLEM

254,000 square miles in extent. Farms of green states and a small section of Mexico are embraced within this watershed. But the abundant water contributed to the discharge of the Colorado by several states and by Mexico bears no definite relation to the extent of watershed in each. This will be seen from the following figures compiled from records of the United States Geological Survey:
