

HARRY GRAVELLE IS BURIED

Funeral services were conducted at the gravesite in B. C. Cemetery Sunday afternoon for Harry Clyde Gravelle, 76, who died Nov. 14 at the home of his daughter, Dorothy Smith, 6912 Pecos St., Las Vegas.

Mr. Gravelle was born June 4, 1893 in Albuquerque, New Mex., and at the time of his death was resident agent for the Diamond Gold Mining Co. in Nelson guarding the Techatticup mine and mill which are almost 100 years old.

A resident of this area for 48 years, Mr. Gravelle was manager of the Boulder City Store & Recreation Hall for Six Companies from 1931 to July 1934 during construction of Boulder (Hoover) Dam. He served as a U. S. Marshal in the District of Nevada from 1934-38.

He leaves two sons, William of Reno and Harry of Fair Oaks, Calif.; two daughters, Dorothy Smith, Las Vegas, and June Eddins, Hampton, Va.; eight grandchildren.
