

Hoover Dam engineer Garland dies

WAYNESBORO, Pa. — Milton W. Garland, who was called "Mr. Refrigeration" by his engineering peers for his pioneering work, died Wednesday. He was 104.

Garland worked on Hoover Dam, where he helped design refrigeration systems to cool the water, sand and rock used to make the concrete amidst the scorching temperatures of Southern Nevada.
