

Shaw Pays Fine \$1 Per Mile for Speeding

One dollar a mile, for every mile he sped above 35 miles per hour—that is the fine paid by Floyd Raymond Shaw of Nelson, after a hearing yesterday morning in the court of Justice of the Peace Claud G. Casey.

Shaw was going 65 miles an hour in the mile stretch between the auto courts at the edge of Boulder City and the checking gate, according to rangers, and he admitted his excessive speed at the hearing.

The fact that Shaw's family lives in Nelson, and that he is employed at the Bureau of Mines in Boulder City, necessitating daily travel, was cited at the hearing and Shaw was not deprived of his C ration book for gasoline, but he was given warning that there must be no further infractions if he expects to keep his gas ration card.
