

Six Companies Sued For Death Of Welch

A suit against Six Companies Inc., has been filed by Mrs. Emma Jane Welch for \$50,000 to recover judgment for the death of her son, Marcus Wayman Welch.

Welch, who was also known as J. W. Matson, who was employed as a jack hammer man for the Babcock and Wilcox company, died June 21, 1935, following an accident on the Boulder canyon project.

The plaintiff alleges in the complaint on file in the office of County Clerk Lloyd S. Payne that Claude A. Bacon and A. B. Gilbert, Six Companies Inc., employes, handled the lowering of a certain casting in such a manner that a platform on which Welch was working was torn loose, throwing him to his death. Austin and Ralli are the attorneys for the plaintiff.
