Boulder Canyon And Black Canyon Investigations

Historical Records

- No. 1 - Boulder Canyon - 3 boxes, containing about 1000 lbs of material, taken from the upper part of the lower terrace of the upper canyon, about 100 feet above the river bed and near the downstream end of the present dam.
- No. 2 - Boulder Canyon - 1 box, containing about 1000 lbs of material, taken from the river bed at its mouth.
- No. 3 - Black Canyon - 1 box, containing about 1000 lbs of material, taken from the upper part of the hill on the west side of what is known as the "Millwright's Bend" at El Estero, Arizona side.
- No. 4 - Black Canyon - 1 box, containing about 1000 lbs of material, taken from the lower part of the hill on the west side of the bend on the Arizona side, from which the land has been reclaimed about 10' above the river surface.
