

Boulder Pioneer, Injured in Fall From Roof, Dies

BOULDER CITY, Jan. 6—Leon A. Williams, 64, of 632 Ave. M, prominent Boulder City pioneer, died at the local hospital today at 9 a.m. following injuries he received Saturday when he fell from the roof of a house he was helping his son build at 615 Ave. M.

Funeral services are tentatively set for next Saturday at 3 p.m. at the LDS church, but final arrangements will await the arrival of relatives.

Mr. Williams was born in Bethany, Mo., Jan. 4, 1889, and came to Boulder City in the early days to work on construction of Boulder Dam. A building contractor, he took an active part in community affairs. He was a member of the Chamber of Commerce and the Recreation Assn. and owner and manager of the Boulder City brickyard and the Hitching Post motel.

He is survived by his widow, Bessie, who was at the bedside when he died; four sons, Frank of Boulder City; Louis of Reno; Daniel A., of Boise, Idaho; and Francis L., of Sydney, Australia, and eight grandchildren.
