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A. O. George, Dam Worker, Is Killed

Crushed between two trucks at the workings in Black canyon, A. O. George, mechanic for Six Companies Inc., died last night shortly after an accident which occurred at the auto repair station below the lower portals of the Nevada diversion tunnels.

The accident occurred at about 11:30 p. m., and George was rushed by Six Company ambulance to the hospital in Boulder City, where he died several hours later.

He was working on a dump truck at the time of the accident, when another truck back into him.

George was 40 and single. He lived formerly in San Bernardino.

George was working his first shift for Six Companies when the accident occurred and had worked but 35 minutes.

The coroner's jury found that "deceased came to his death from accidental injuries, consisting of a fractured skull, fractured ribs on the left side, a severed right arm, the breaking and crushing of both legs, all of which caused shock and hemorrhages, sustained when he was crushed between two trucks. The accident was unavoidable."

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
