Drouth Moves To All Parts Of the World

A drouth, of unprecedented proportions, extending over much of the civilized world, is bringing wholesale crop ruination and loss of life to human beings and animals, it was revealed today as reports of the terrific dry spell were brot in from all parts of the globe.

The death toll in the United States alone is 150, it was revealed, following a week of stifling temperatures and drouth. The United States damage was estimated, unofficially, at one billion dollars.

Press dispatches from India, Russia, the Balkans and a portion of Asia, revealed that those nations also were suffering from a lack of water and that crops in those sections were withering beneath the torrid heat of an almost tropical sun.

Torrential rains, in other sections which had been visited previously by the drouth, promised to ruin what crops had been withered by the sun.
