

Death Of Paul Rignell Saddens Boulder City

On Father's Day, June 18, Paul M. Rignell of 609 7th St. in Boulder City died from a lingering illness. One of the tragedies of his passing was that his final illness prevented him from accompanying his wife, May, to view with pride the graduation from the U. of Utah, their son Paul, a full fledged doctor of medicine. Paul, a graduate of the Boulder City schools has registered at the LDS Hospital in the Residency Program. He is majoring in internal medicine.

Paul Rignell was 78

years old at the time of his passing. He was a retired electrician from the test site. Previous to that during World War II he had been employed at BMI and was known and admired by many pioneer electricians from the Boulder Canyon Project. Paul never joined the local Elks but remained with the Las Vegas Elks membership. He worked on Cashman Field and took part in many Helldorado Day projects.

May Rignell, well known Boulder City surgical nurse was happy in

a marriage that lasted 38½ years. She described her husband as, "kind, gentle, soft spoken and a wonderful father to our son, Bob." When Bob played his freshman year at the U. of Wisconsin, his brilliance on the field reached the attention of Morry Zenoff (also a graduate from Wisconsin U.) and he had Bobby on his program on Radio Station KBMI.
