

REVISED CITIZENSHIP RATING

Please return this form with your rating. Score every student who has been in college as much as 1 quarter, or in high school 1 semester.

This is the revised estimate of the point system for awarding the Citizenship Cup to Resident and Day Student Clubs. The points are awarded under 5 heads as indicated in these sheets. Under no one head may any one student make more than 30 points altogether from all the people who score her.

1. Academic Attitude -

1. Any college girl who has shown interest and independence in her work may be scored from 0 to 2 for each quarter's work by each teacher. Any high school student may receive from 0 to 3 points a semester, no more than 6 for a year by each teacher. (Remember - there are 2 Semesters in High School during a school year, and 3 Quarters in College during a school year).
2. Any girl whose attendance has been irregular or whose attitude has been poor may be given minus 2 a quarter in college, or minus 3 a semester in high school.
3. Any girl who has given or received illegal aid in class room or preparation should have 10 points deducted from her total score. This information will come from the academic dean's office to this office.

II. Athletic Attitude -

Sports to be considered:

1. From 1 to 5 points will be given each girl participating in the above activities. Interest, enthusiasm, unselfish participation, and good sportsmanship are to be considered.
2. For unsatisfactory attendance from 1 to 3 points should be deducted from the score of each girl participating in the above activities.

III. Attitude toward Rules and Regulations -

Boarding Students - Preparatory Department

1. No major or its equivalent - 30 points.
2. For each major or its equivalent, deduct one point from 30.
3. For each week of campus (don't count accumulations) deduct 5 points from 30.
4. For expulsion, the student's record shall be wiped out.
5. For suspension, deduct 10 points for each week of suspension.

Boarding Students - College Department

1. For every 5 merits off deduct 1 point from 30.
2. For each week of campus deduct 5 points from 30.
3. For expulsion, the student's record shall be wiped out.
4. For suspension, deduct 10 points for each week of suspension.

Day Students

1. No major or its equivalent - 30 points.
2. For each major or its equivalent, deduct 2 from 30.
3. For each council major, deduct 6 from 30.
4. For each council penalty except a minor, deduct 6 from 30.
5. For each day of suspension, deduct 3 from 30.
6. For probation, deduct 10 points from 30.
7. For expulsion, student's record is wiped out.

Officers shall be rated according to the foregoing scale for each quarter. If the student absolutely fulfills her responsibility, she will receive the total number of points allotted in the above scale for each quarter she holds office. If she is indifferent, or inefficient she will be rated off from one to total number of points for the quarter. Each minor officer will be rated by a committee composed of the sponsor and the president of the organization. The ranking officer shall be rated by the sponsor.

V. Social Attitude -

From zero to thirty points will be given each girl for her social attitude on the campus. Each resident student will be rated (from zero to ten by the following three committees:)

1. Her social club president and sponsor.
2. Her hall sponsor, hostess, and proctors, and hall president and Vice-President.
3. Dean of Students, Y.W.C.A. Faculty Adviser, and a student committee composed of a representative from college Council and prep Council, Publications, Athletic Association, and classes.

(From zero to fifteen points will be given each day student by the following two committees:)

1. Her social club president and sponsor.
2. Her unit sponsor, the student council president, and the two proctors (first and second semester proctors).

The club committee should consider the following phases:

Initiative, willingness, and thoroughness in assuming responsibilities; Friendliness with attention given to attitude toward unpopular or shy girls and to girls who are considered poor citizens; cooperation in projects; enthusiasm and loyalty.

The hall committee should consider the following phases:

- a. Trustworthiness, friendliness, unselfishness and consideration toward others.
- b. General care of personal belongings and room; attitude toward and consideration for school properties.

The general committee should consider the following phases:

General attitude, thoughtfulness, loyalty; fairness in various relationships, manners, self control, poise; participation in and enthusiasm for campus activities; acceptance of various types of discipline incident to living in a group; contributions to college life as a whole.

This committee should consider estimates from class organizations.
