






The Belmont Estate was noted for its statues inside the mansion and on the grounds. In 1866 Adelicia procured in Italy Sans Souci by Chauncey B. Ives (A) and the Sleeping Children by William Rinehart (C). The former statue is in the possession of Dr. Oscar F. Noel, Jr., while the latter statue is in the mansion. Lions still guard the steps on the driveway (B), and Arno, a copy of a sculpture by Horatio Greenough (D), continues to grace the grounds.



Adelicia also purchased in 1866 Ruth Gleaning by Randolph Rogers (A) and Rebecca at the Well by Chauncey B. Ives (E). Ruth Gleaning is the one statue which has always remained in Belmont Mansion, while Rebecca at the Well was later returned. The busts of Demosthenes (B) and Cicero (C), Acklen pieces, are in the possession of Dr. Oscar F. Noel, Jr. A statue of Hercules (D) continues to stand outside the mansion.
