

Since ~~1914-15~~ 1937-38 marks the 25th ^{year} ~~anniversary~~ since the ^{consolidation} ~~formation~~ of Ward Seminary and Belmont College to form Ward-Belmont School, it is of particular interest to look back upon the activities and traditions which have started and grown during these years. Incorporated in 1914, its quarter century of activity has given it a history that is vivid and interesting in all its aspects and ^{one} which has seen it grow from a girls seminary to one of the leading junior colleges of today.

Traditions

The traditions and their recurring activities are the memories which are dear to Ward-Belmont girls. First of these in the fall is that of Class Recognition Day ^{an activity} in which the entire school participates. Led by their class officers and sponsors, the members of the various classes dressed in white and their respective colors march from the chapel to form rows before Academic Building. The recognition of the classes is conducted by the academic dean followed by the presidents pledge to the school and the singing of the Class Recognition Day ~~xxx~~ song by the entire student body and faculty.

Another one of the fall traditions is that of Senior Week, every day of which is marked by some activity for or by the members of the graduating college class. The week is opened by the recognition of the class as the Senior Class of that year and ~~xxxx~~ includes a class banquet and dance, a reception for the student body and faculty and a chapel service at which a senior is the main speaker.

In a ceremony pledging the students to international peace and good will, the entire student body gathers ~~around~~ on the main campus Armistice day morning to participate in a flag raising H.
