service. The students are addressed by the president of the then school and take the oath of xkirginner allegiance to the flag.

The traditional dinners at Ward-Belmont are many including the formal ones on malloween, Thanksgiving, Valentine; St. Patrick' Bayxx when the decorations carry out the spirit of the holidays.

Washington's birthday with the costumed seniors forming a court for The elected George and Martha, the elaborate birthday dinners, and the All-Blub Banquet the closing night of school are other occasions which have grown with the years.

Servants Program held annually the evening before the students depart for Christmas vacation. At this time every servant employed by the school appears upon the chapel platform and in a program prepared by them entertain the students and show to them and to the school their appreciation for their annual holiday gift.

The day which is marked by the greatest amount of class spirit is that of Senior-Senior-Middle Day held in the spring between the members of the two college classes. The activities begin in the early morning and extend until darkx including within their scope parades, decorations, cherring sections and interclass athletic contests in baseball, bowling, archery, and tennis.

May Day is by far the most colorful and attractive of the annual traditions. Featuring a queen elected from the senior class and two attendants from the student body, dances are held in upon the main campus which the entire student body participates. Particularly colorful is the court formed by the queen and her attendants and the members of the senior class dressed in pastels.

Closing both the traditions and the school year the Step different Singing exercises held two evenings on the steps of Academic Building. At this time the members of the college graduating class sing their farewells to the campus, are formally inducted into the Alumnae Association, and in finally give over the steps to the graduating class of the coming year.
