A wide range of courses is offered, and besides the general diploma from the junior college, the students may work for ^{eight} certificates or diplomas in ~~the~~ special departments: dancing, physical education, art, home economics, expression, ~~and~~ music, riding, and secretarial training. There are both terminal and continuation courses. These former are provided for the students who wish only two years of college work and in that time wish to obtain a liberal arts education or specialization in one of the departments.

For the students who expect to transfer to a senior college upon the completion of their junior college work, Ward-Belmont gives courses which parallel or are comparable to the freshman and sophomore courses in the particular college^s or universit^{ies} to which the graduates~~x~~ are seeking entrance. Certain of the large Eastern girls' school^s accept Ward-Belmont junior college without entrance board examinations if their ~~work~~ work has been in the upper strata of their class.

Since the students come from all sections of the country and later attend many different types of institutions, the teachers are from different parts of the country, and have different kinds of training, though each is a graduate of an institution of recognized standing. They are selected with the general idea that personality and an ~~earnest~~ earnest^{desire} to direct, guide, and teach are on an equal basis with formal training. - The size of the classes and of the teacher-load is far below the maximum permitted by accrediting organizations, thus enabling the individual student to have an unusual amount of time given her not only in class but in conference. At present the proportion of faculty members ~~to~~ students is one to eleven.
