buy furnishings for that Washington home, that Adelia fell victim to pneumonia and died in her room at the fashionable Fifth Avenue Hotel on May 4, 1887.

Pauline had married James William Lockett of Macon, Ga., a graduate of Washington and Lee University who was a student there when Robert E. Lee was president of the college. His father, an engineer, had built the first 100 miles of railroad

in Georgia and was prominent in that state's history.

Pauline's daughter, born at the Massachusetts Avenue mansion (for years next door to the Canadian Embassy), was Pauline Adelia Lockett. She married Franck Hyatt, Jr., son of a prominent physician in Washington, and they had two children, including Franck Hyatt, III.

When Pauline Lockett Hyatt was divorced, her son was only five years old. When she married Millard P. Kaiser of St. Louis, the child's name became Franck H. Kaiser. It was he who attended the recent ceremony at Cheekwood.

Kaiser said in a recent interview that he could remember that he, as a child, helped his grandmother, Pauline Acklen Lockett, down the long flight of stairs at the Washington home that had been her mother's wedding gift to her.

Pauline, Kaiser's grandmother, died in 1932, and her daughter "paid hundreds of dollars to have all the statues crated and sent on loan to Ward Belmont College," Kaiser said.

Eventually a trust company was in charge of sale of the Massachusetts Avenue home, and it was sold in 1962. How the painting got left behind in the trunk room of the attic is not known. How it passed from the trust company to Tandler is an involved affair. But the house has been torn down and an office building stands on the site.

But Kaiser and his wife have in their St. Louis home seven of the family portraits that hung at Belmont for years and then at the Washington home until the family moved to St. Louis. Now Kaiser and his wife are planning to move to Nashville and bring the seven portraits—never before published here—back to Nashville.

In the collection is a handsome portrait of Adelia's father, Oliver Bliss Hayes, a distinguished lawyer who came here from his native South Rokeby, Mass., and built a brick mansion he called Rokeby, on what is now Grand Avenue, on the site where The Upper Room building stands today.
