Cherished memories still live among the Ward-Belmont girls. Telephone calls, wires and letters have come from all over the country since the rumor of a reunion started. And today there is a waiting list of those who were late in replying. Belle Meade County Club can only accommodate 564 for the dinner scheduled for March 21. Only those having reservations for dinner may attend the other planned activities.

Alumnae from 28 states will come by plane, car, train or bus just to get here. One letter from California stated, “I’d come all the way to Nashville if I didn’t do anything but just get to join in singing ‘Bells of Ward Belmont’ once again. It would be the trip.”

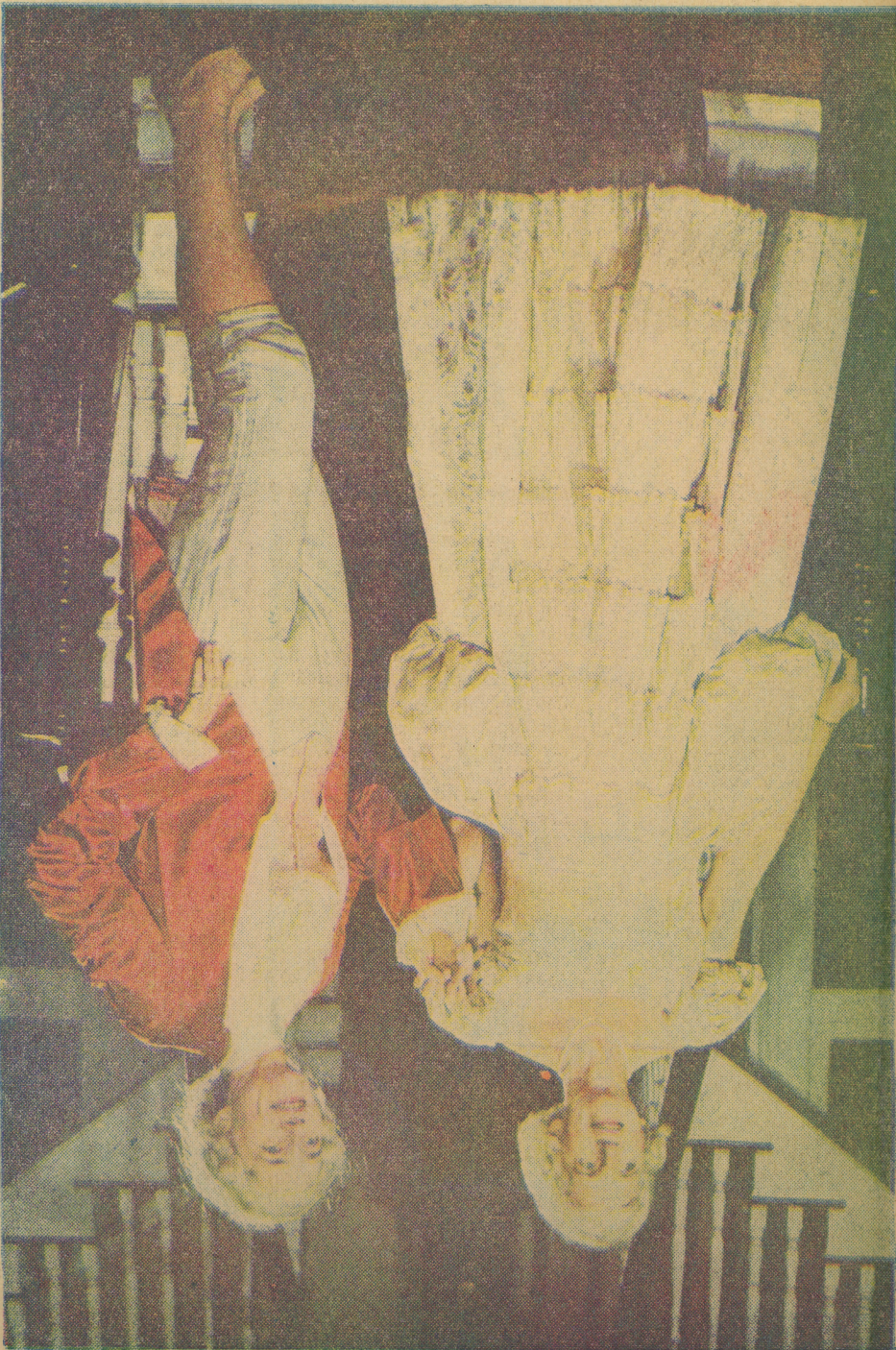
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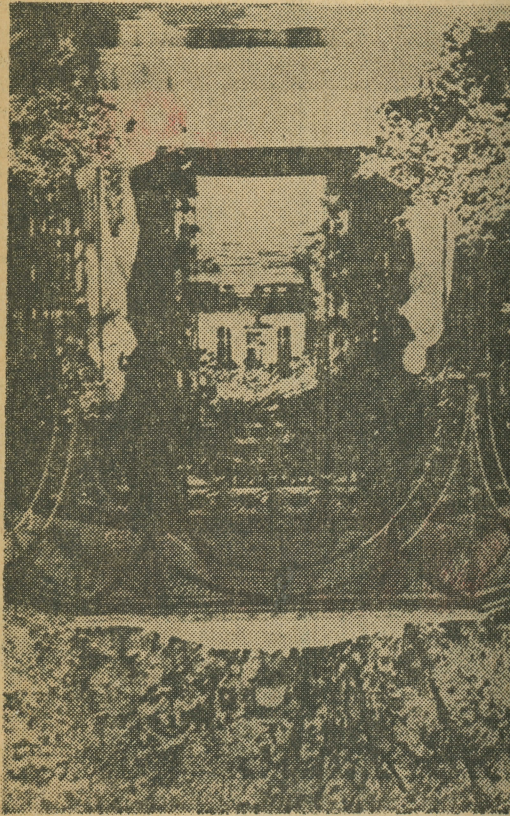

beth Cayce portrays George.



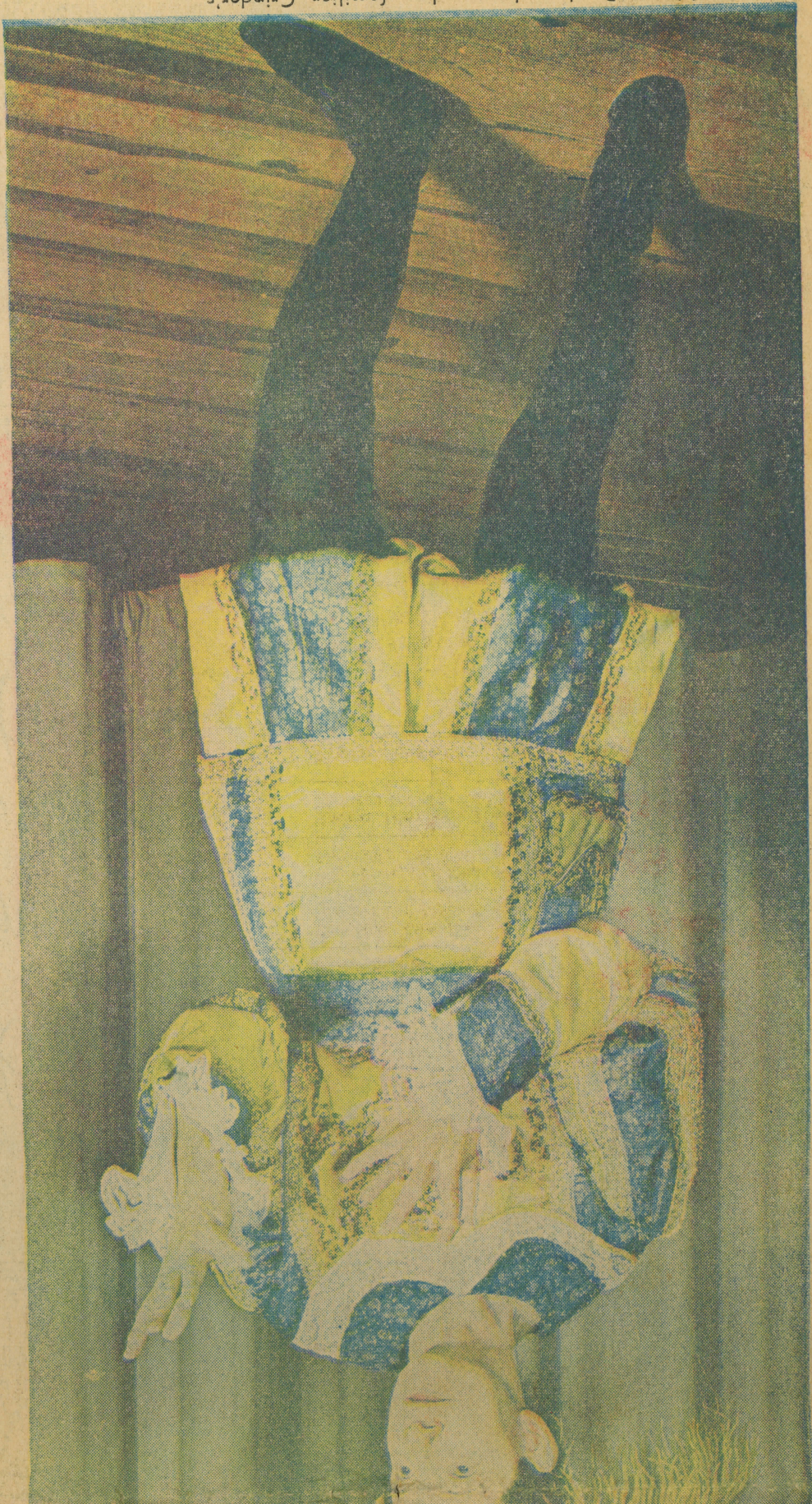
