***What I remember best about my Ward-Belmont days...**

In the 1930's, students were not allowed to wear make-up (lipstick was forbidden). We couldn't leave campus until the day ended. We had marvelous chapel services; classical artists performed, who later became famous! We had a marvelous dance department, and athletics were required every

week. We had an Intramural "Club" competition-none with other schools. We were taught by dedicated teachers and entered the best colleges. I went to Smith College in Massachusettes. I took an eight week trip to Europe in 1936 (a highlight of these years) to attend the opening day of the Olympic Games in Berlin, where Hitler attended.
