If I happened to arrive too early I sometimes wandered down to the stage in the auditorium where our recitals were held. I liked to see the two big concert grand pianos we used.

When I entered Ward Belmont
College as a student, the
Conservatory had moved across
the street to a large house. During
this time I learned more about the
scope of music and came to
appreciate it even more. Students
were invited to usher at the
Nashville Symphony and I
attended many recitals. Sometimes
artists on tour in Nashville came to
the school to play for us.

I planned another vocation and worked toward that after I graduated but I still have a great appreciation and love for music. I continue to sing in a choir, play in a handbell group and listen, listen, listen for the sound of music all around me. Thanks, Ward Belmont for teaching me to hear!
