
A Proposed Clubhouse for Young People III

The Community Youth Project began in May '86 with the hiring of a full time Youth Worker and a part time supervisor. Since then, the following two support committees have been formed:

1)Youth Programming Committee

Consisting of three local young people from the Myrtle Park drop-in (Lana McCormick, David Liket &Bruce Scott), the Youth Worker, supervisor and parent rep (Paul Overend), this Committee:

- -assesses teen needs
- -plans teen programming
- -relays information to the Youth Services Committee.

2) Youth Services Committee

This Committee brings together representatives from parent groups, schools, District Council, NV Rec Commission, churches, local merchants, service clubs, "Alternatives", RCM Police, and other agencies dealing with young people. It provides a forum for:
