Teacher and also owned a small farm on the outskirts of Westerville. (40 acres)
married: Loretta Lucile Adams June 25, 1900 in Westerville O. Rev. Daniel Lambert performed the ceremony. It was shortly after my father graduated from Otterbein College (class of 1900). My mother went 4 years also but did not graduate because she repeated H.S. classes in the Academy (Martin Boehm Academy no longer in existence). She would not have needed to do so but she was afraid she was not sufficiently prepared for college when she entered after graduating from a 3 year H.S. at New California O. at the age of 16. She is listed in the class of 1903 of Otterbein College.

She was b. Nov. 16, 1874 in Paulding Co. Ohio

She died Aug. 1930 in Westerville O and is buried in Otterbein Cemetery Westerville O beside my father and near his parents Rev. and Mrs Daniel Lambert.

We lived from 1908 till they died on this farm except for the last years of his life when he sold the farm and moved up on N. State St. Westerville O.

He was married 4 times.

2. About a year after my mother died he decided he should be married and married a widow Mrs Ethel Brown from Hamilton, O. They met on one of his High Y trips as he was a N.Y. Leader for South H.S. Her son aged 18 was in the N.Y. in Hamilton O. She was 56 and a good woman but they did not hit it off at all. They had no known each other for very long. She also had a girl of 9 who came with her to Westerville to live. Before the year was out they were divorced and she went back to Hamilton. She took back with her what she brought some linens and silver. No one profited from the divorce.

3. Then a school teacher in South H.S. introduced him by mail to Martha Phillips Vanderheff Gunn, ... a widow. She was divorced from Mr Vanderhoff but the widow of Mr Gunn who owned a ranch near Denver Colorado. She was a little younger than he was.... now 92 and living in Bethany Towers, Hollywood Calif. Has her own apt there which she got a good many years ago. A rather remarkable woman... writer... still published some stories in 1971 and 1972. Dad and she met at the Worlds Fair in Chicago and decided to get married. They were married for 19 years and lived in Westerville all that time. She was very strong willed and he was very strong willed and they pulled against each other instead of with each other. They were divorced in about 1951. Neither got ahead of the other in the divorce. Both had long tales to tell at the hearing.... so none profited from that divorce. She went to California where her daughter Lucile Vanderhoff Wilson lived in Pacific Palisades quite well to do people. He was in real estate. Martha lived first in Manhattan Beach Calif.... had a series of houses which she sold each time at a profit.

She did not know why he wanted the divorce but found out soon after.
4. He had just that of how nice it would be to marry Henrietta Dupree Leshner a grass widow of 19 years with 7 children living in Columbus and a friend of the Lambert and Hopkins family for 60 years. So he married her. They got along fine and seemed happy. She fitted into Westerville just fine. He said it was all right for him to marry her he knew we would think for he had known her for 60 years. He invited none of his children to any of his weddings. She died in Florida in Jacksonville in 1972. at her daughter Eleanor Leshner's. She was a nurse the only unmarried one of Henrietta's children. I liked Henrietta very much but am also still friends with Martha. We had literary likes in common.

My grandmother Adams lived with mother and dad from the time they were married. He had lived in Westerville, had a house of her own, when mother was in college. She also had a house full of furniture and dad and mother had nothing to start with. So she lived with them and they used her furniture till they got enough money to buy some of their own. Grove City was my dad's first job after college.

Grandma had typhoid fever at the time I was born and so it was all hard on my mother.

Anyhow I graduated from Otterbein in 1923 and left Westerville to teach H.S. first in Bell Brook O. and then in Boardman (near Youngstown O.) I did not like teaching and so in 1925-26 went to N.Y. State Library School Albany, N.Y. I was a librarian from then on.

I was in various places. In 1930 while living in Muncie, Ind and being Reference Librarian and Head of Circulation in the Muncie Ind. Public Library I met my husband Richard Myers Warfel who was living in Yorktown Ind 7 miles from Muncie and working in Muncie. He was b. Oct. 1, 1904

We got to Pgh because of the depression. Dick got into steel at that time and was general manager of a steel warehousing company here for 15 years (part of the time gen. manager after he learned the business.) *Worked in steel 15 years.*

He died June 10, 1970 of a Coronary.

Before that he became a design engineer for Vacuum lifting devices.

Elsie was the first of the Lambert family (Dan's children) to graduate from M.S.

All that went to Otterbein but her graduated from Martin Boehm Academy as all colleges in those days had academies. Martin Boehm was co founder of the U.S. Church with Philip Wm Otterbein. Guess Ida and Eva had common school educations unless they went to a M.S. or college we did not know about. When Elsie came along Westerville had a first grade M.S. for the first time.
