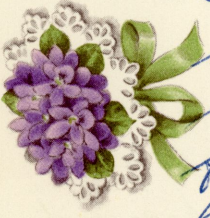


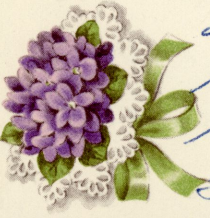

life.

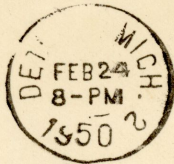
Dot did you call Dr. Riley
