Also on Sunday when I spoke to Jonathan + mentioned Georgie he too felt as I did that Georgie had died after 1938. I located my little old address book + on that back leaf read that George Galton Harris (named Galton for Francis Galton, father of Eugenics + a teacher of Karl Pearson with whom Arthur studied in London) was born Sept. 21, 1919 and died in March of 1940 - the exact date in March I do not recall.

Note also in the obituary that
Arthur was awarded the coveted
Welden Award from Oxford Univ.
(I recall when we were at U of Chicago
that Prof. Sewall Wright a re-
nowned geneticist & a younger col-
league of Arthur at Cold Spring
Harbor - was awarded the same
Welden Award in the late 40's.
He knew the Wrights & he learned
that it was only the 2nd time an
American was the recipient - the 1st
was Arthur Harris.)
