My daughter Susan (the oldest) lives outside of Philadelphia in Westtown. My other daughter, Elizabeth, and my oldest son live in the immediate area. Tim, the youngest, lives in Boston. He teaches at Boston Univ.

It is interesting, that you seeking information are in fact providing much more information to me; clarifying some of the things I did know; if only vaguely.

I am looking forward to the data you are sending. I've been trying to arrange clearly all that you have reported on the phone; but those reports will help in my notes.

I am looking forward to the opportunity of seeing you and your sister; so please let me know when and where.
