

The Administrative staff would like to extend our congratulations to the class of "93" as they graduate from Badger High School to face the challenges of modern society.



The Trumbull County JVS is located on a 100-acre site on Educational Highway in Warren, next to the Trumbull Campus of Kent State University. It offers 27 vocational programs to students in the 11th and 12th grades of its 14 home school districts. Transportation to and from the JVS is provided by the home schools. ## If you're planning on going to college . . plan on taking the ACT!

Planning for college takes a lot of hard work for a junior. The first step usually begins with taking the ACT test.

Registering for the ACT must be done a month ahead of time by filling out the ACT student registration packet. The registration packet contains a 90 question interest survey, questions of grade information, a 190 question student profile section, and some general questions on the student.

The actual ACT test consists of 75 English

questions, 60 math, 40 reading, and 40 questions on science reasoning. The test usually lasts three and a half to four hours on a Saturday morning.

Scoring on the ACT is from 0 to 36-a perfect score. Scholarships can sometimes depend on how high or low the score is. The test can be retaken as many times as needed to improve as much as possible.

The ACT test is a tough test to take, but the college-bound students must do it. There is only one way to get out of it-the SAT test.

## Hugh O'Brian Youth Leadership Seminar



#### Natural Talent Ecology Team Captures State

"After years of studying; numerous meets held in the freezing cold, rain, and mud; water fights; and trips to Ponderosa; we did it." Our team won the State Envirothon.

Our winning streak started in March with the Tri-County meet in Mahoning County. Next, we defeated sixty-four teams from Northeast Ohio at the Area II meet in Stow. As the N.E. champions, we were entitled to compete in the state meet, along with nine other state finalists, in Cincinnati. At this time, we represented the best of 265 Ohio teams in the knowledge of wildlife, aquatics, forestry, soils, and environmental issues.

As the state champions, we advanced to the Nationals held in Maryland for a week of competition. The highlight of our endeavors was earning second in the nation in both forestry and wildlife. The team placed fifth out of the fourteen represented states in the comprehensive areas and eighth in the presentation.




