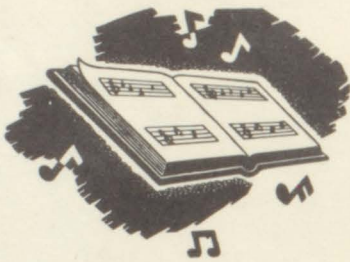
Rachel and Yvonne returned here for their Freshman year; and our last, but far from least, addition came during our Junior year. This addition, of course, was Les.

I, Frank Carmichael will my typing ability to Cub Barr.

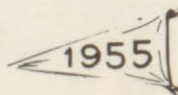
