The excitement increased as the class rings were received. We sold Christmas cards and refreshments at basketball games. The Junior play "He Couldn't Marry Five" was successful. From these and other scources the class procured money to finance the prom at the Shenango Inn in Sharon. The annual trip was to Washington and Gettysburg.

As seniors we had finally reached the most important year in school and the sponsorship of the yearbook under the leadership of Mr. Schettino. We collected ads to pay for the publishing. Our class started the custom of presenting the gavel to the junior class president at the end of the year. We also presented a play which was a source of money for a gift to the school.

It is now the end of our senior year and all twenty-one will continue to make history. You will probably read about us and should recognize our names in the years to come.
