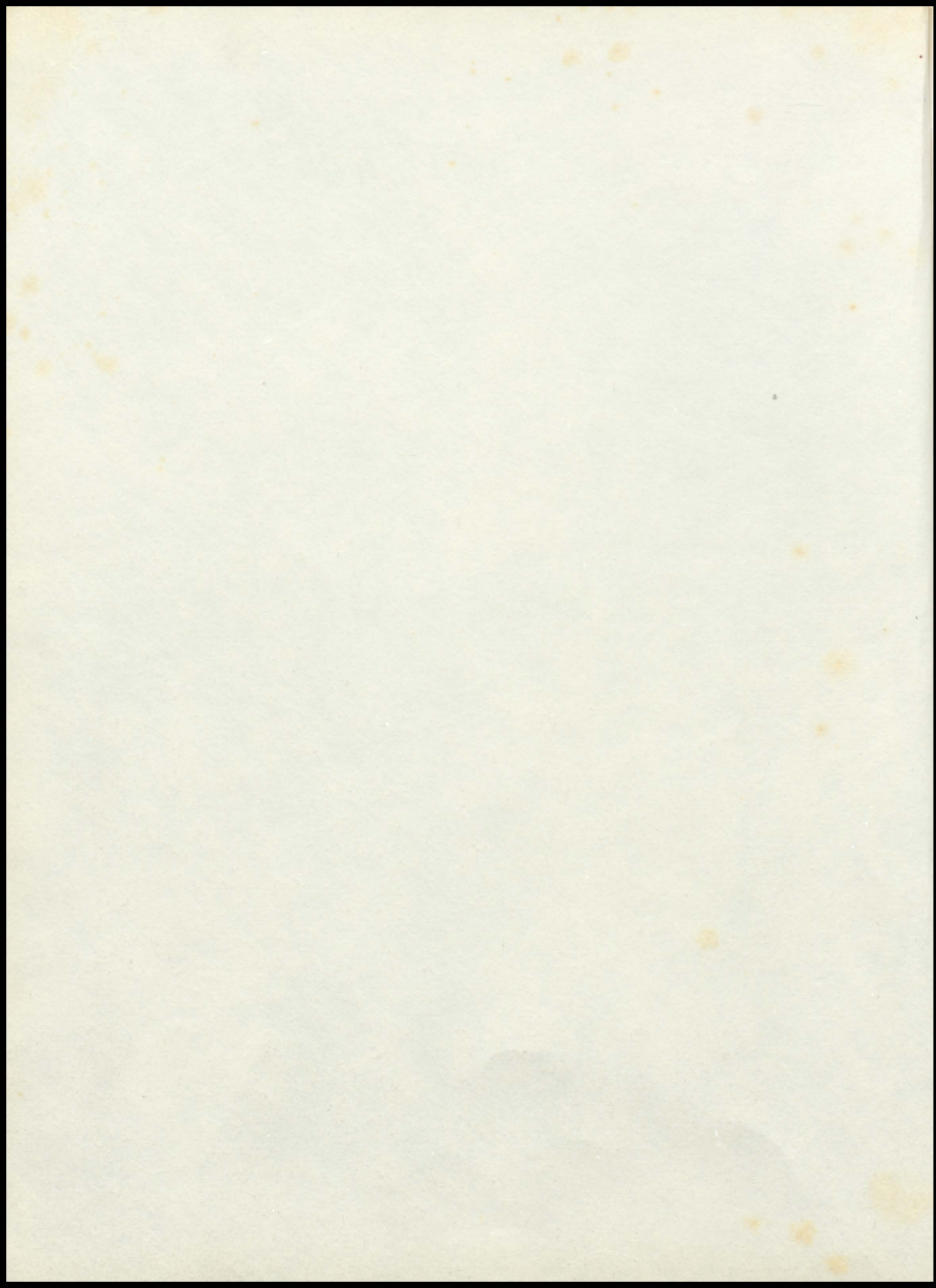

But there are lessons taught down there I want this child to learn;

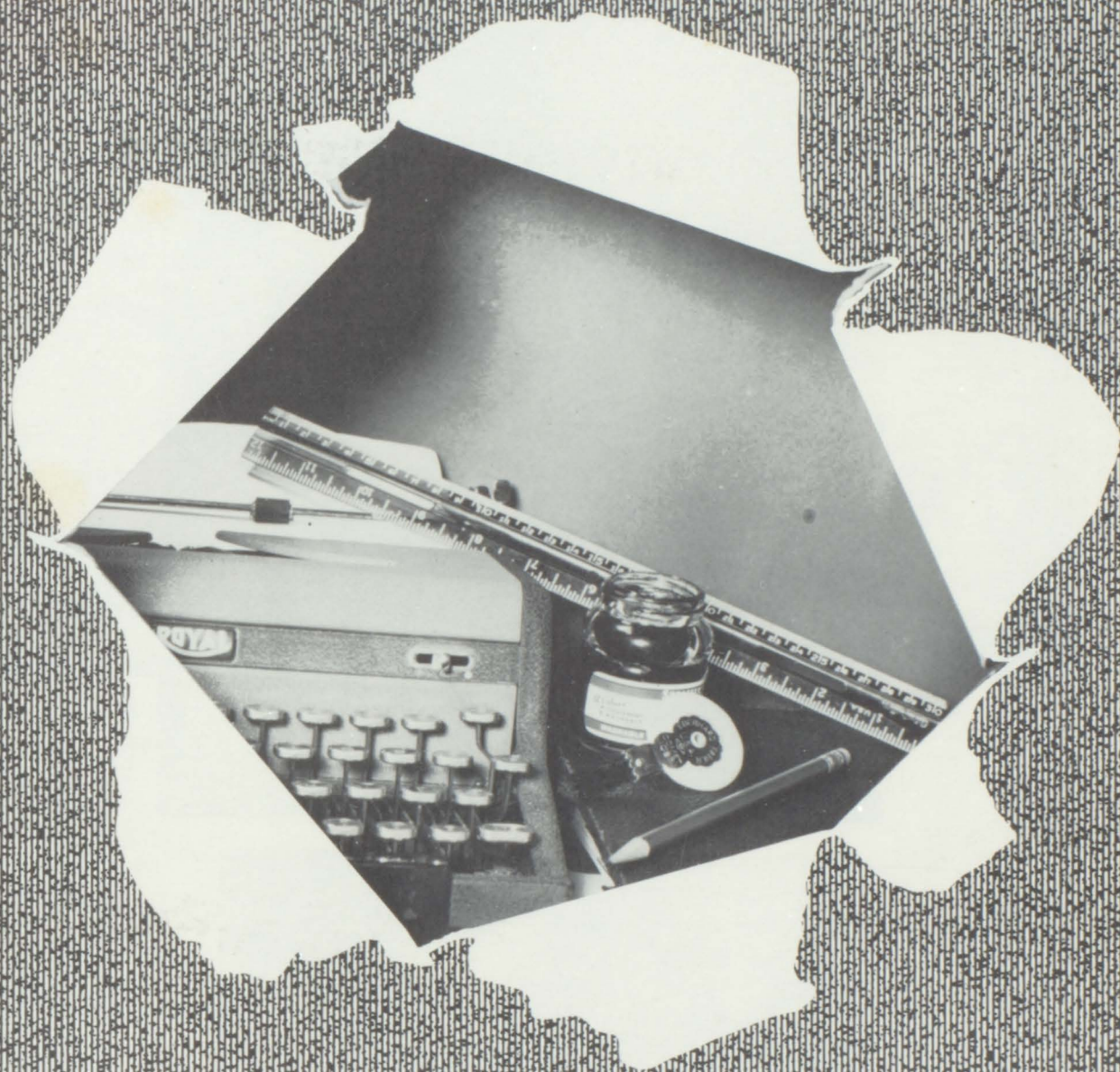
I've looked the wide world over in my search for teachers true,

Nor hate Me when I come to call to take him back again.

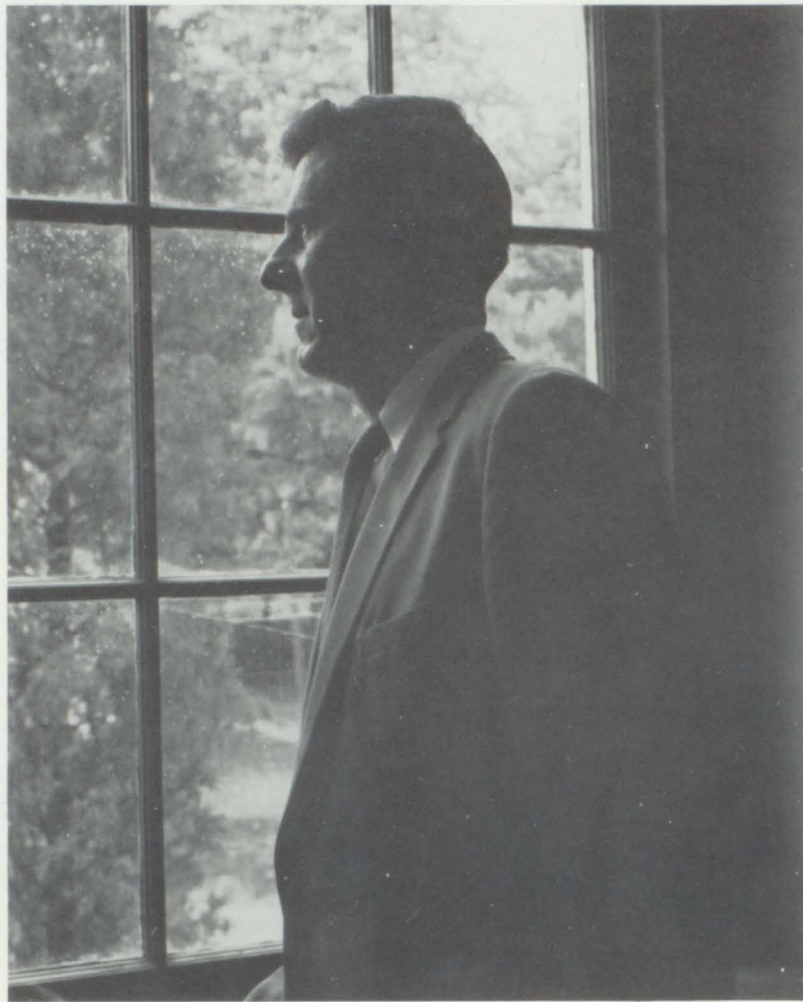
I fancied that I heard you say, "Dear Lord, Thy will be done,"

Class History

And now the big moment arrived, We were halfway to our goal; we were seventh graders. Instead of being the "big shots" we were now at the very bottom again. We had to start and work ourselves back up to the top. This time, though, as the elders

of the whole school, not just of the grade school. This goal would mean the Seniors of Vernon High School. We were under the supervision of Mr. Whipkey this year. He did a tremendously good job of trying to teach us to act as grownups, and we wish to thank him.

In the fall of 1958 we began the school term as juniors. This was our year for working harder than ever if we expected to go on the trip to Washington, and to sponsor a prom for the seniors. With the superb and excellent guidance of Mr. Gelsomino, we reached our financial goal and then some. We would like to extend to him our deepest appreciation for everything he did for us. We will never forget him. We were glad to accept to our class two more members this year, Barbara Underwood and Joan Reighard, although we were also deeply sorry to see two other members leave who had been with us since the first and sixth grades respectively: Delores Osborn and Michael Bobbie.

In our junior year we sold candy at noon in the lower hall, had all sales at the basketball games, sponsored a dance, and put on our play entitled "Don't Darken My Door." We inexperienced actors were scared to death but the play was a big hit.

Toward the end of the school year we received our class rings and began planning for the Prom. We held it at the Mahoning Country Club. Both the Prom and our trip to Washington will be very pleasant memories.

Ah! At last we are seniors. We the Senior Class of 1960 have the honor of being the last class graduating from Vernon High School and this will be the last Vernon yearbook. Consolidation with Kinsman, Gustavus, and Hartford makes us a part of the Joseph Badger Local School District.

Our main project for this year is the yearbook. With the fine and understanding guidance of our class advisor, Mrs. Glowe, we all hope to make this the finest yearbook possible. We wish to leave a good impression in the minds of many as to the fine capabilities of dear Vernon High.

We twenty-six, as the graduating class of 1960, wish to thank all our parents and all the faculty from the bottom of our hearts for giving us these twelve years in which we have shaped the paths of our lives. We only hope that some day you are as proud of us as we are of you for giving us this opportunity to become fine, upright, worthy citizens of this great United States of America.

Here is Jean Parks, who is nowadays a famous woman wrestler. You never would have believed it, would you?

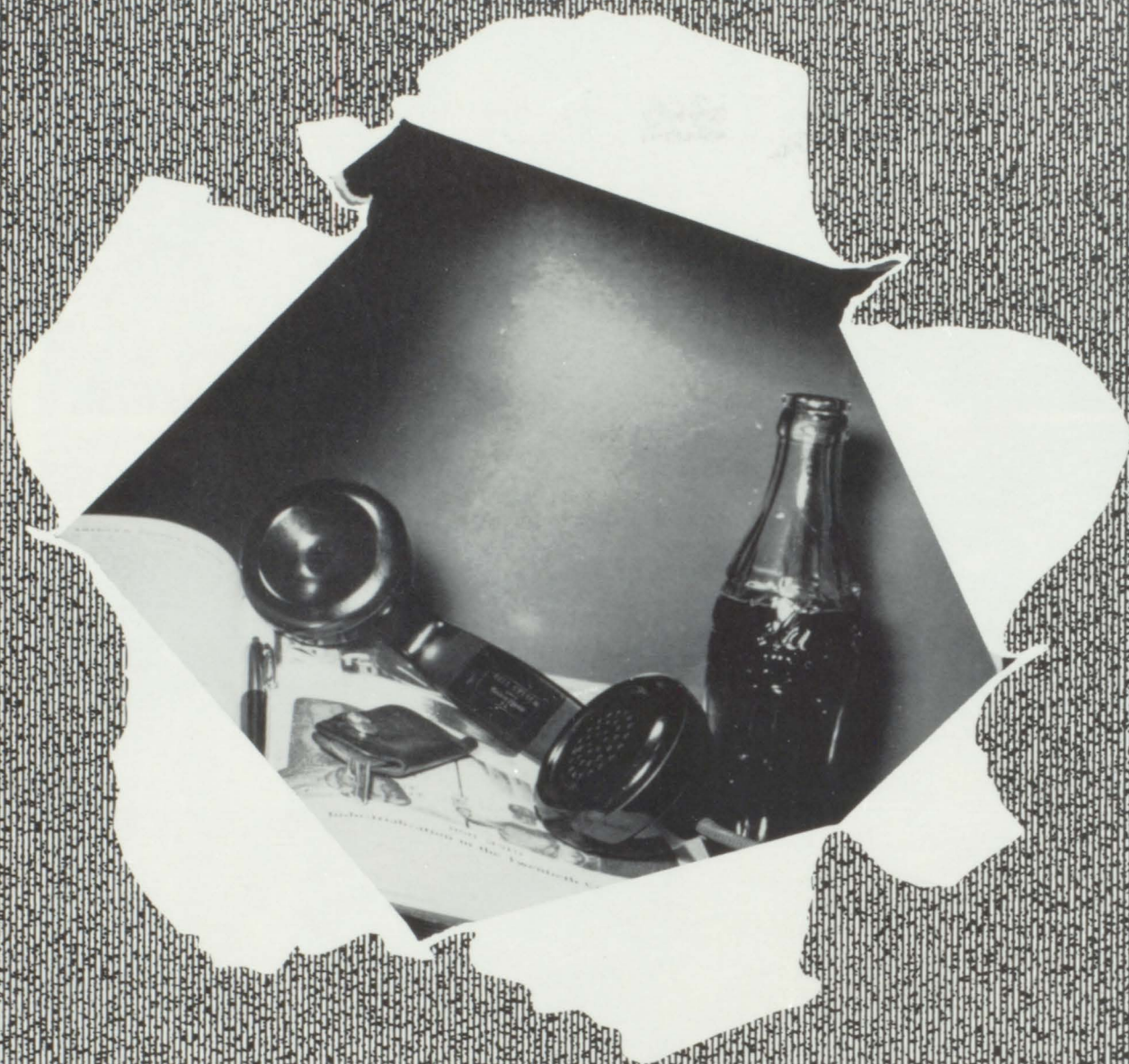
Alan Smith is coming up the walk now. He has a body shop where he repairs worn out bicycles.
