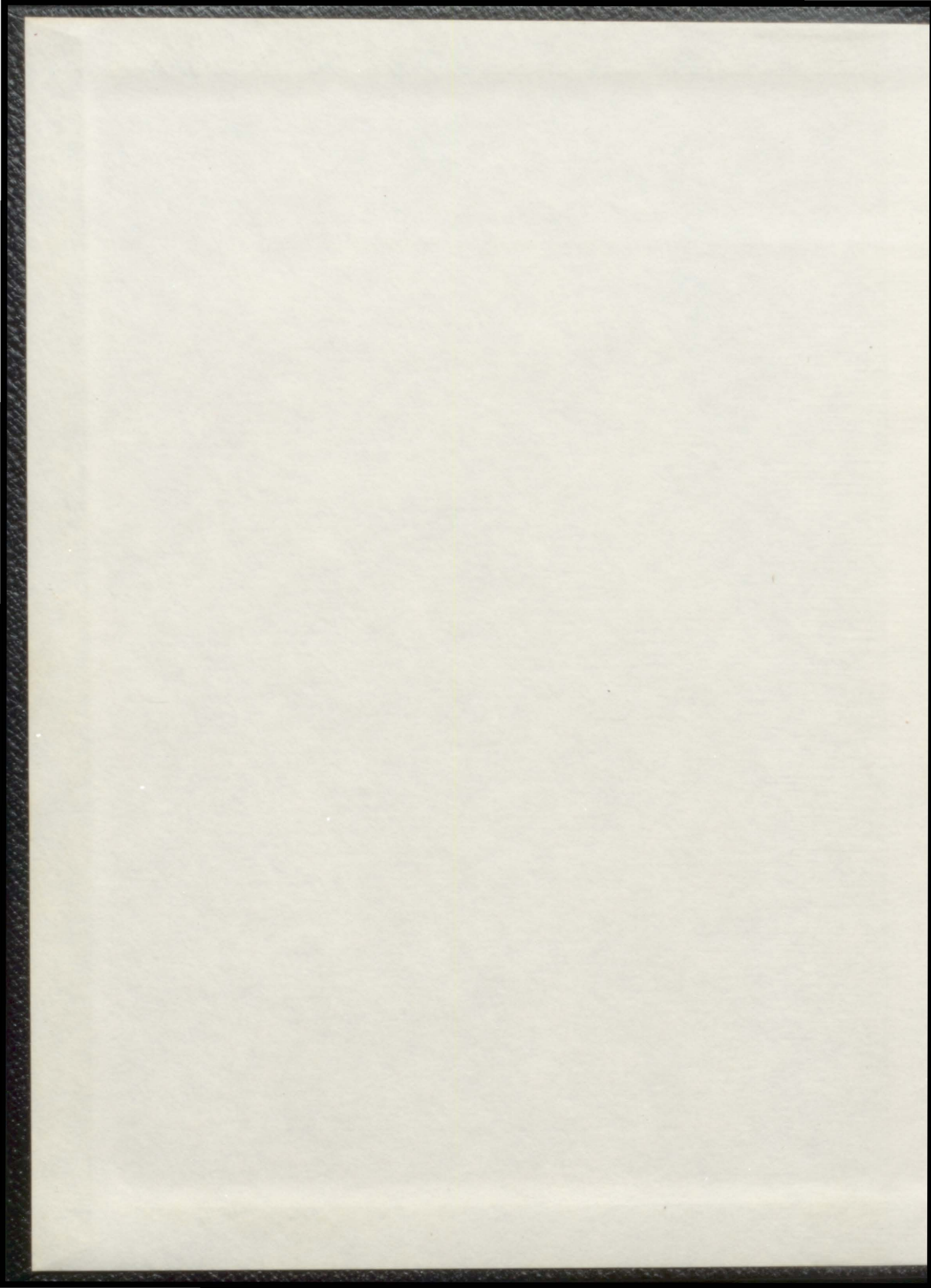
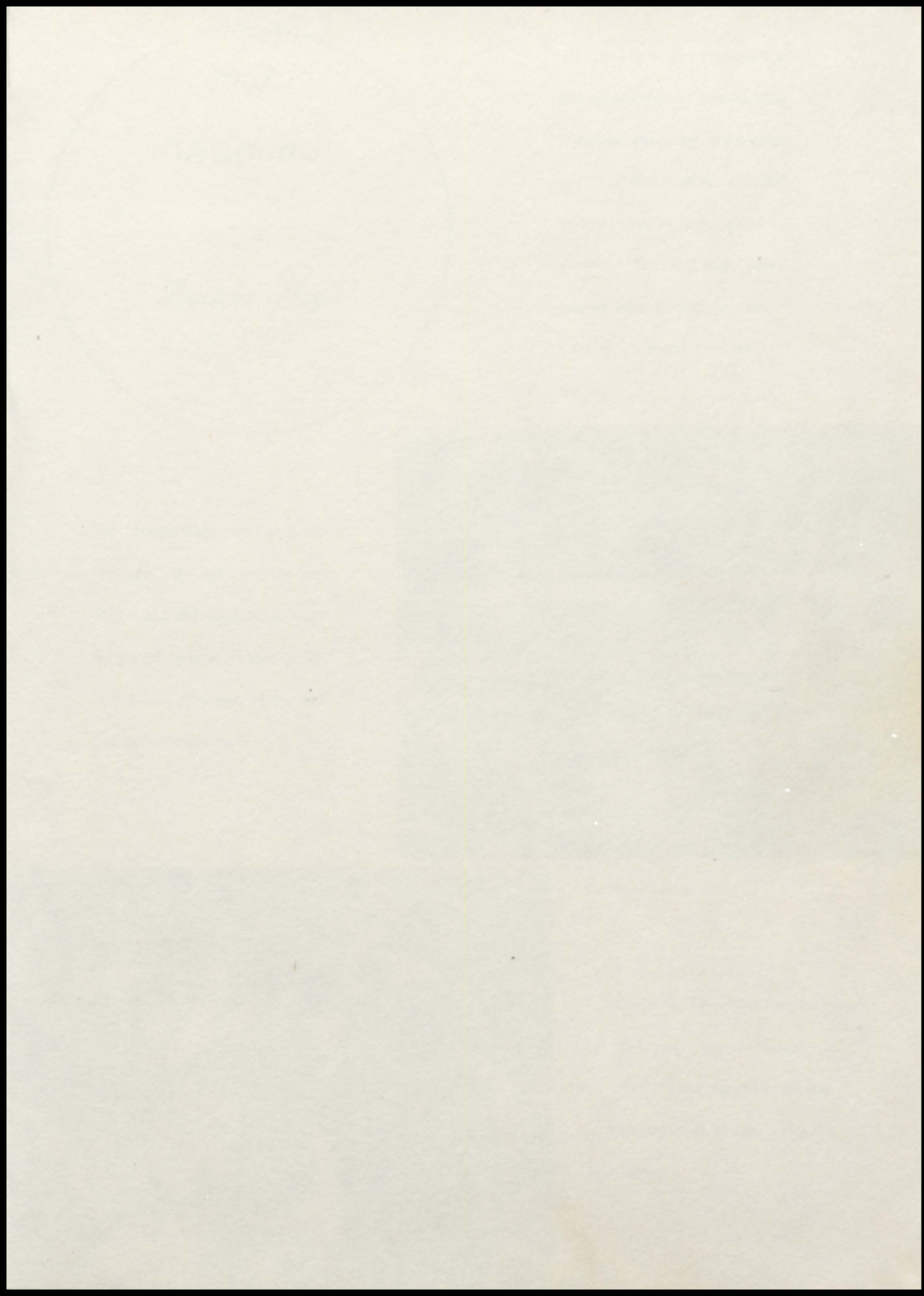
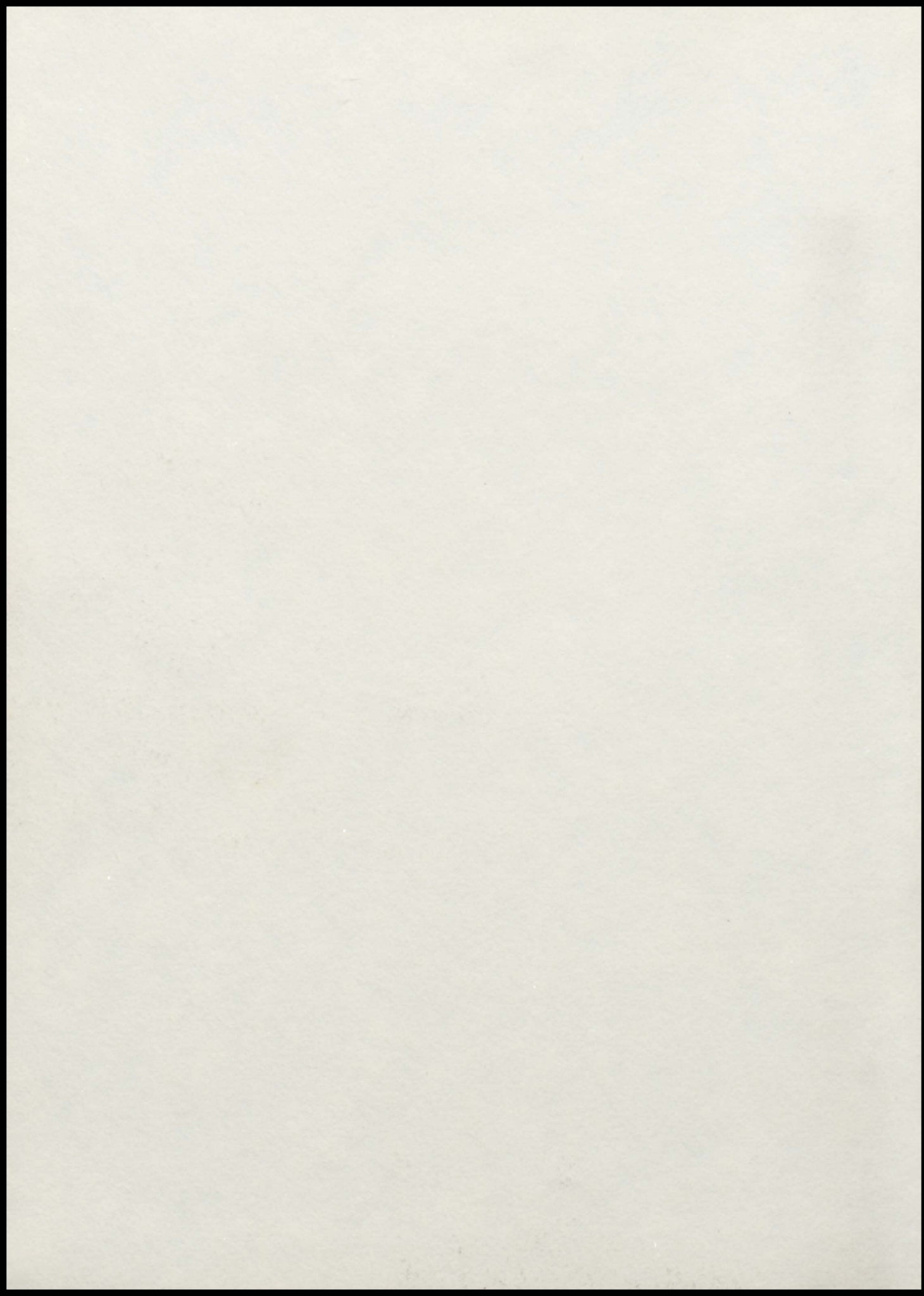

We become acquainted with our teachers - the strict and the lenient - and find them all interested primarily in us as individuals. The bands, choruses, clubs, and teams become ours.

We come to Badger High excited and apprehensive. The building is strange and names are confusing. Old faces are outnumbered by new. But we lose ourselves in activity. Bells call us to learn, and we learn even if we don't want to. A friend emerges from a stranger.



Somehow, after nine busy months, we belong. We've changed and this book attempts to catch the moments that brought about this change.

Our Name —

On January 1, 1960, the Joseph Badger Local School District became a reality. Much preliminary planning by the Ohio State Board of Education, the Trumbull County Board of Education, the Trumbull County Superintendent, and the local Boards of Education of Hartford, Vernon, Kinsman, and Gustavus townships had culminated in the consolidation forming the new school district.

At this time, however, the new district was nameless or was referred to merely as the "consolidation." Suggestions for names were solicited from all students from all four schools. Each school chose one name to be placed on the ballot and to be voted upon by the students of the four schools. From this balloting our name, Joseph Badger Local School District, was chosen.

Who was Joseph Badger? He was an itinerant minister sent into the Connecticut Western Reserve as a missionary from the Connecticut Missionary Society. Born of professing Christian parents in Wilbraham, Massachusetts, in 1757, he grew to young manhood and joined the Revolutionary army in 1775. After spending three years with the army, he returned to Connecticut, married, and fathered seven children. During this time he became deeply interested in religion and, after pursuing theological studies, preached in some of the New England states.

The urge to do missionary work caused him to come into the Western Reserve, leaving his family in Connecticut for over a year before he returned and brought them to the Western Reserve. He arrived in Youngstown in December, 1800, on horseback. He rode on to Vienna, where there was only one family, on to Hartford, where there were three families, and then on to Vernon, a bustling place of five families.

His memoirs continue with accounts of his traveling throughout western Pennsylvania and northern Ohio. He went as far west as Sandusky where he ministered to the Indians for several years. His home was in Austinburg from 1802 until 1810, when he moved to Ashtabula. In his travels throughout the district, he was disturbed by the great lack of books. He became a book dealer and shipped in quantities of books, often being cheated by worthless books sent with the good from the dealers in the East. The schools and libraries in the area benefited greatly by his labors.

On horseback he traveled into our four townships often and through his efforts, the first church in Hartford was established in September, 1803. His writings tell of preaching often in Vernon and Kinsman or "giving instructions to a number seriously inquiring after truth."

In 1825 he with his second wife (his first wife having died in 1818) came to Gustavus to live. Here he organized a congregational church of twenty-seven members. The membership grew during his ministry to seventy-five. He remained there, serving also as postmaster, until October, 1835. His voice had become very weak and his hearing had failed. After ten years of quiet retirement in the Maumee Valley where he occasionally returned to the pulpit for a sermon or two, he moved to Perrysburg where his long and useful life ended.

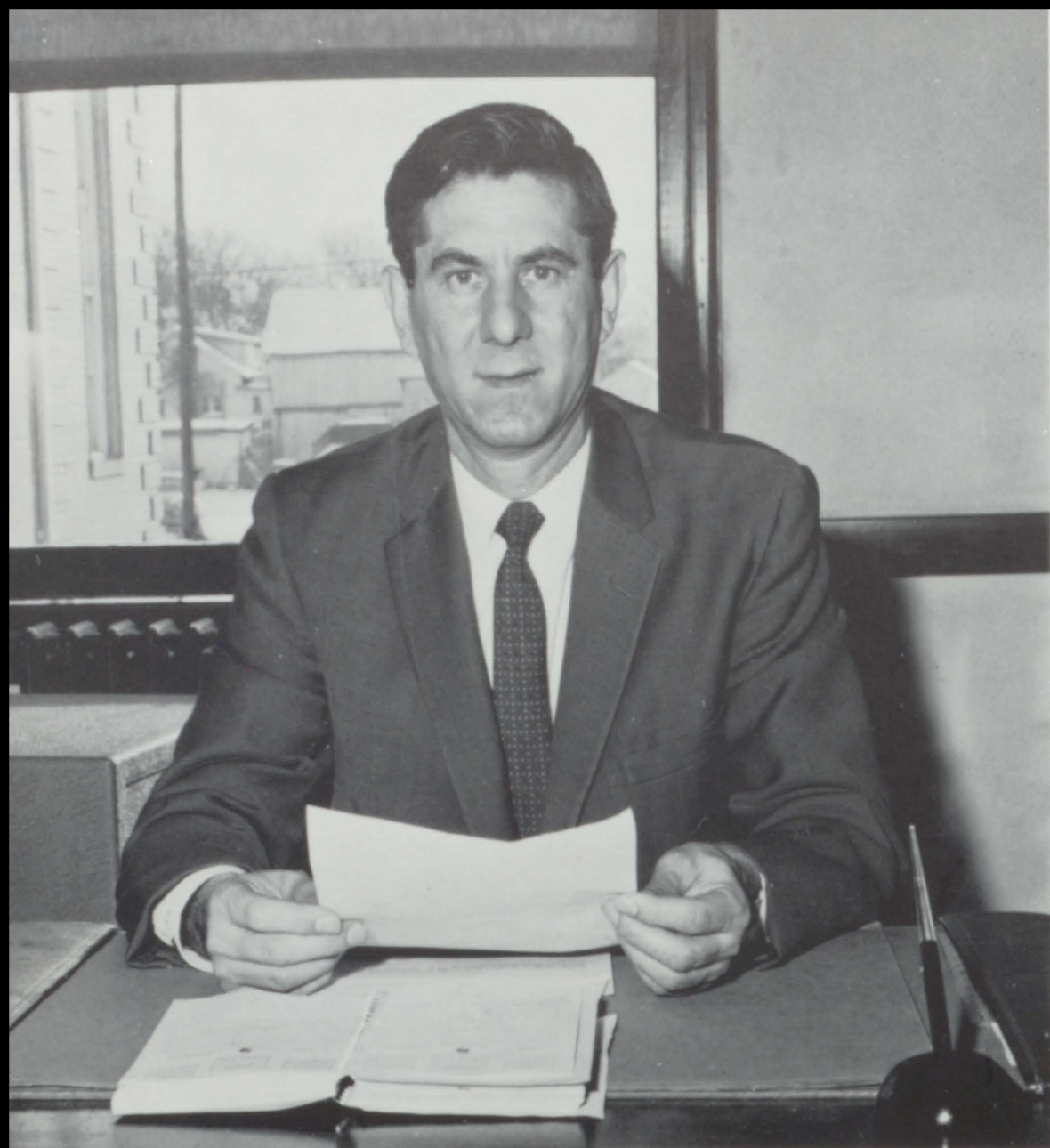


A Message From Our Executive Head —
