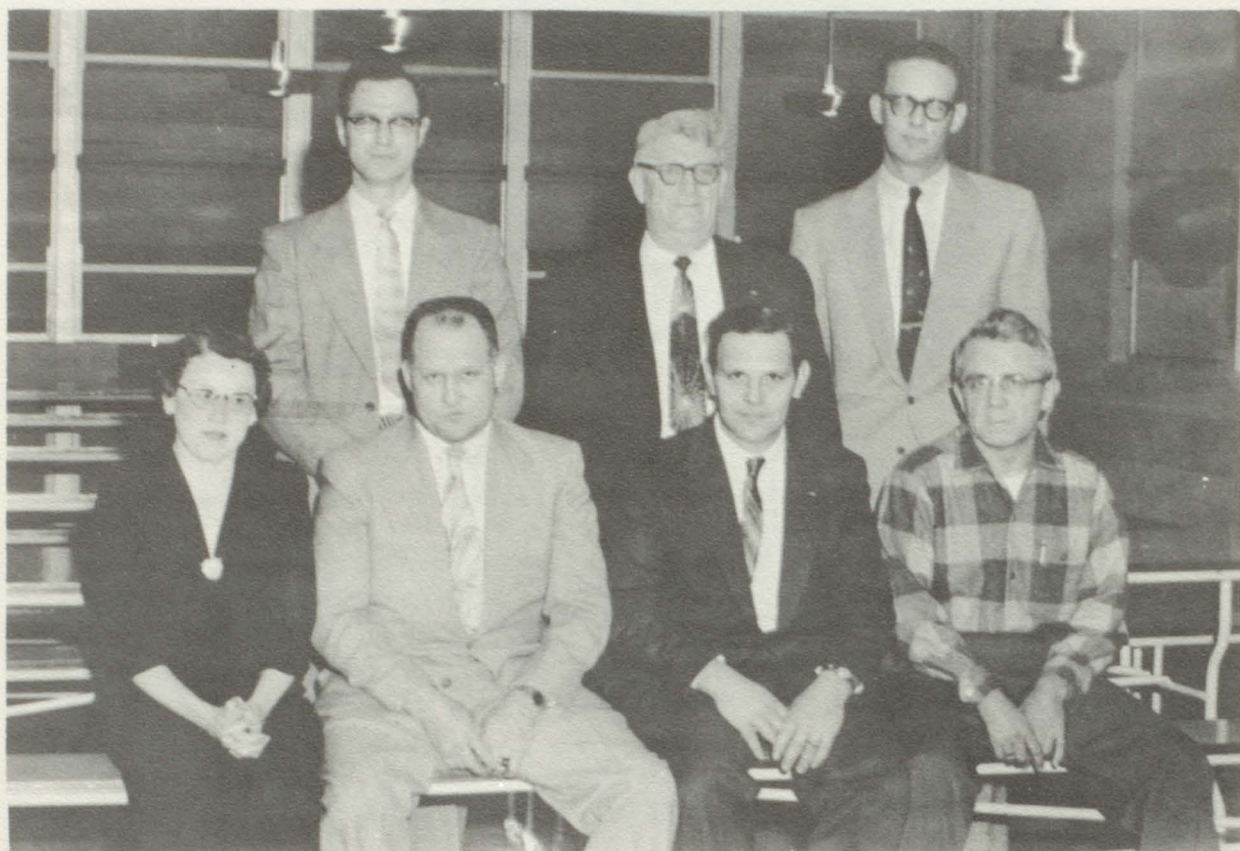
DEDICATION

Here's luck!

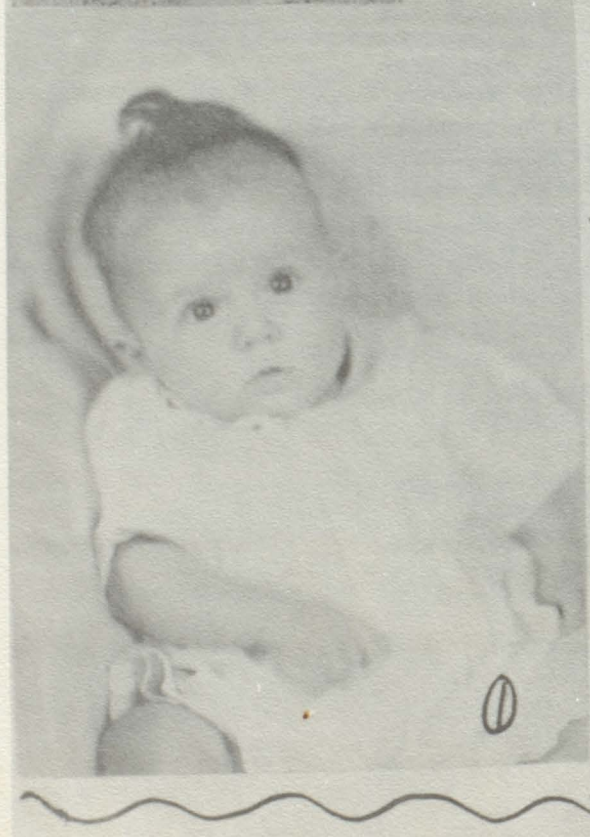

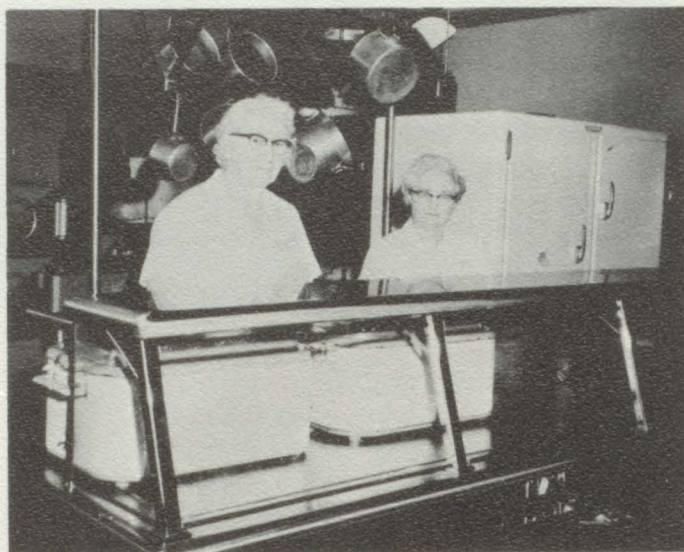
Clifford Taylor has been driving our school busses for the past fourteen years.

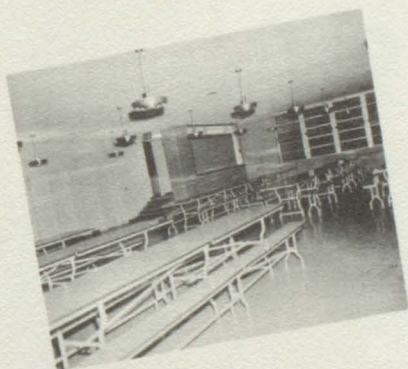
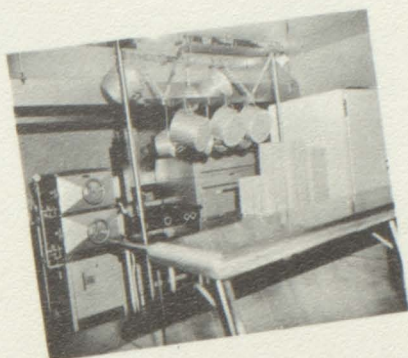

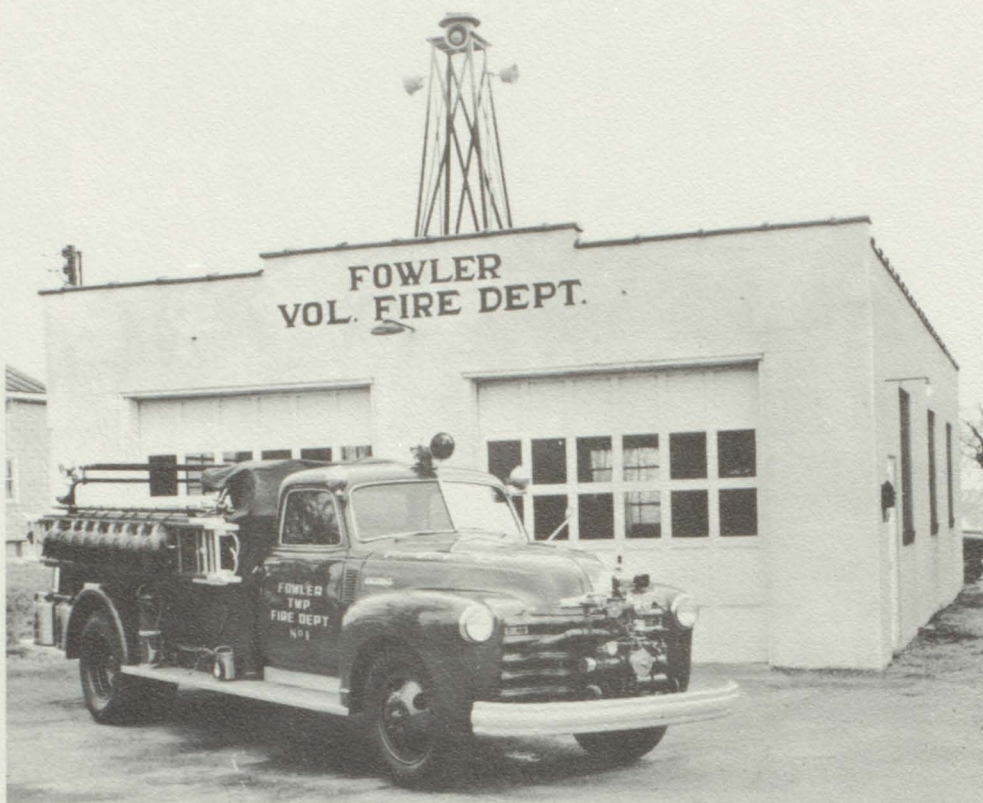

1. Tell the operator you wish to report a fire or emergency in Fowler Twp. She will know in advance which phones to ring, so you will not have any numbers to remember.
2. When connected with the person designated to receive calls, be prepared to give the following information.
 - a. Your name
 - b. Location of property or emergency
 - c. Name of road or any land mark to identify the exact location.
