Mr. Thomas became Superintendent as we entered the ninth grade. In high school the changing of classes and many teachers were a little confusing for us, but somehow we made the grade. In our junior year Mr. Coldiron joined us as our superintendent, with more new teachers.

Now we are Seniors! We have seven members--Shirley Bacon and Betty Cushman who still remain from the first grade, Shirley White and Nancy Cole who started in the fifth grade, Irene Glover and Helen Huffman in the tenth grade, and Jack Coldiron who came at the beginning of our junior year.

Our senior year now comes to a close. All of us are preparing for another stepping stone in Life. With all the bustle there is a thought, which brings sadness to our happiness, "We are leaving Johnston High School." With many a backward look at the school, we know that life will busily continue beneath the banners of Red and Blue. We say "Adieu" and turn away, eager to take part in life.
