Class History

The period of time is 1945 through 1957; the place is Vernon High

School; you are there.

As slowly we walk into our room we are greeted by our first grade teacher, Mrs. Karr. All thirty-two of us are seated now. Of these thirty-two, fifteen of our original classmates are still with us. Although they have changed considerably their names haven't; they are still Donna Baxter, Dale Blair, Lillian Bloom, Martha Brugler, Harold Burbach, Roberta Collins, Reta Lou Dilley, Herman Jackson, Eva Oakes, Charles Smith, Josephine Stackhouse, Mary Alyce Steadman, Richard Unangst, David Wells, and Peter Williams. Of course, it was no job to teach us our ABC's and how to count, print, or read!

It is now September, 1946, and thirty-one of us are second graders. Our new teacher is Mrs. Lillie. We girls just loved her because she let us play with her fur coat. This year Judith Watson, one of our present members. joined us.

The time is now September, 1947, and we have been promoted to third grade. We added another permanent member, Larry Gallatin. This year our teacher was Mrs. Jennings. There are still thirty-one of us. Here we

began to learn how to add, subtract, multiply, and divide.

On to the fourth grade in 1948, where our class is divided. Part of us are in with the fifth graders and part of us are with the third graders. We change rooms for some classes. This means that all of our class even though we are divided have both Mrs. Wall and Mrs. Jennings for teachers. In this grade we racked our brains just to learn geography from Mrs. Wall. Now in September, 1949 we are fifth graders and there are twenty-six

hard to get an A from Mrs. Wall.

Now in September, 1950, we are finally the "Big Deals" of the grade school. We are sixth graders. Thirty of us enjoyed the wonderful guid-

ance of Mrs. Seaholm.

This year, September, 1951, we feel we are starting all over again as we walk slowly clear to the top floor. Yes, we are seventh graders. As usual we got in the wrong place the first day. We just couldn't seem to get on to changing classes, but with the help of our instructor, Mr. Delpero, we came through in no time. This year out of the thirty-three members, which is the largest our class has ever been, Donald Gruver and Lee Wilson are members of our class and have been with us ever since.

September, 1952, and we are eighth graders. There are thirty-one in our class now and we are under the direction of Mr. Anderson. We still can't understand why this year everything that happened they always blamed

As we go on into September, 1953, we are intelligent "eighth graders" or Freshmen. Janice Perkins who is still with us is one of the twenty-six members of our class. We were initiated by the Sophomores. I think we had as much fun as they did! This year, with the help of Mr. Rechedy, we began earning money to reach our goal.

We are Sophomores this September, 1954. There are only twenty-three of us now and we still have Mr. Rechedy as a home room teacher. Of course money is our biggest problem, but we're working. We initiated the Freshmen,

for which they will never forgive us.

Steve Lucik joined us as Juniors this September, 1955, which makes twenty-three class members. We know we are really going to have to work this year - not only on books but for our class, too. But we have very little worry because of the wonderful supervision of Mrs. Heberling, whom none of us will ever forget. To earn money we had dances, sold tee-shirts, sweat-shirts, jackets, pencils, school emblems, bracelets, home-made candy, candy bars, potato chips, hot-dogs, and pop at the ball games, and also we raffled cakes at our ballgames. Then came the play on November 3, which also helped us to earn money. The Junior-Senior Prom was next on the agenda. After some difficulties it was decided to entertain the Seniors and all high school teachers at the Jade Room in Youngstown. Herb McPherson and his orchestra were enjoyed greatly and we all had a wonderful time.

At last this September, 1956, we are twenty-one happy Seniors. Many activities are scheduled for us this final year. We also have to think about earning some more money. But by now we are quite accomplished! We plan to have dances, a supper, sell stationary, present a Senior Play, and other activities to earn money. Our main project this year is the yearbook. We are hoping that with the advice of our understanding advisor, Mrs. Glowe,

our yearbook will be a success.

As we think of all the things that have happened we are quite proud of ourselves. We feel that we have participated in all sports and activities to the best of our ability. From the time we were Freshmen the majority of our class has been participants in all sports. We hope our parents, who we thank with all our hearts for making all these wonderful years possible, are proud of us also and may be proud of us in the years to come.
