ABOUT The Cast

ROSANNA CARTERI (Violetta), Italian soprano, made her operatic debut as Elsa in Lohengrin at the 1949 summer outdoor season of the Rome Opera at the Terme di Caracalla. After successful appearances with the Rome Opera House and at the Florence Festival, she made her American debut in 1954 with the San Francisco Opera Company and with the Chicago Lyric Opera. She returned to both companies during the following season. In addition she has been actively engaged in her native country where she is one of the favorite prima donnas of the day. Here roles include Micacla in Carmen, Liù in Turandot, Zerlina in Don Giovanni, as well as the soprano leads in La Bohème, Manon and La Traviata.

CESARE VALLETTI (Alfredo Germont), Italian lyric tenor, made his operatic debut as Alfredo in La Traviata in Bari, Italy, in 1947. A series of operatic engagements followed that took him all over Europe. In 1951 he made his debut at La Scala where he stayed for the following three seasons. In September 1953 he made his American debut with the San Francisco Opera Company; his Metropolitan Opera debut followed a few months later. Since then one of the leading tenors of the Met, he has frequently returned to Europe for appearances in major opera houses. His repertoire includes the tenor leads in Rigoletto, Faust, Don Giovanni, The Barber of Seville, La Cenerentola, Manon and La Traviata.

LEONARD WARREN (Giorgio Germont), made his Metropolitan Opera debut in January 1939 after his sensational appearance on the Metropolitan Opera Auditions of the Air, which he won with no previous operatic experience. After intensive preparations in Milan, the former singer of the Radio City Music Hall Glee Club gradually assumed major roles in the Metropolitan Opera's repertory, which he dominates today as leading baritone. He has also appeared with the San Francisco Opera, the Chicago Opera and the Cincinnati Summer Opera and has sung concerts extensively throughout North and South America. In 1953-54 he made his European debut in his famous role of Rigoletto at Milan's La Scala. Among the operatic roles with which he has been particularly identified are Amonasro in Aida, Tonio in I Pagliacci, Iago in Otello, Don Carlo in La Forza del Destino, Renato in A Masked Ball, Count di Luna in Il Trovatore and the title roles in Rigoletto and Falstaff.
