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PRESS RELEASE - LORETTO'S TASK FORCE BEGINS WORK

Realistic planning for the future of Loretto High School, Sacramento, is now underway. The sisters of the Institute of the Blessed Virgin Mary, who own and operate the school, mandated such planning at their General Chapter meeting in 1981. All American and Canadian schools owned and operated by the IBVM are involved.

In January, 1982, Sr. Nancy Kennelly, American Councillor of the IBVM, visited Loretto High School and met with the sisters working at the school. It was decided that a study value be undertaken to determine the projected needs Loretto High School could meet for the youth of the Sacramento diocese, to inventor, the resources the Loretto High School community could offer to need these needs, and to plan for the continued sound financial futh. Of the school. This study would be undertaken by a Task Force with proadly-based representation from the IBVM and from Sacramento Catholic community.

Sr. Mary Madigan, Rigina Superior, appointed the steering committee for the Task Fo ce this past summer. Sr. Mary Ellen Beck, Sr. Nora Lowe, and Flance Tesluk will coordinate the study of the Task Force.

The Task Force members are: Vicky Alvarez, Mary Chapman, Ernest Coor, William Garrison, Michael Gibson, Sister Aloyse Hackett, William Hallerman, Lola Keck, Norbert Mietus, Sheilagh Neubuerger, Rev. James O'Dea, Rev. Vincent O'Reilly, Julius Ratermann, Sandra Smith, Nancy Tooley, Barbara Wilson, and Bernard Zink.

The initial meeting of the Task Force was held on October 18. A second meeting, on November 4, will result in the formation of committees for the in-depth study. The areas of study will include: ministry to the youth of the diocese, enrollment potential, financial planning, plant development, and IBVM community finances and personnel.

After analyzing the data gathered during the assessment phase the Task Force will formulate observations and recommendations to be submitted to the Regional Council of the IBVM. It is hoped that this study, initiated in January, 1982, will be completed by June, 1983.
