The Institute of the Blessed Virgin Mary had its beginning in 1609 when Mother Mary Ward with five companions opened their first school in St. Omer for Catholic refugee children from England. Offering education for women, the Institute spread throughout Europe, back to England and on to Ireland. From Ireland in 1847, five Loretto nuns came to Canada and in due time a Canadian Generalate was formed.

August 30, 1880, marks the arrival of IBVM from Canada to the United States. Reverend Walter Power and Reverend Maurice Burke, two pastors in Joliet, had written to Mother Teresa Dease in Toronto, asking her now "to do something for the West." This year we celebrate that foundation in Joliet. IBVM worked for thirty-eight years in Joliet teaching in four parish elementary schools and conducting St. Mary's Academy, a boarding and day school for girls. In 1892 Loretto nuns were called to Chicago, to Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan in 1896, and in 1949 our sisters went to Phoenix and Sacramento.
