FROM THE PRINCIPAL:

One with ito the new school year we experienc 'd a 'ational tragedy that left the world dumbfoun 'ed yet, in the midst of such a tragedy, we were ble to find comfort in our daily school roune and in the relationships established within our chool and church community. As we shared our thoughts, our sorrows, and concerns with others, it became easier to cope with the sense of loss and grief. Our daily school routine provided the stability that our children needed to deal with the many emotions involved after this sad event. Being together during morning prayer, weekly Mass, meals and playtime, was a healing agent for many of us and a reassurance for our children that God is in control. Even in the midst of tragedy, there is so much for which to be thankful!

Our school has come so far since the day it reopened its doors in1993. This summer we experienced many positive developments within our school, which I would like to share with you and for which we are so grateful. First of all, for the first time in the short history of our school, all of the classroom teachers have returned to teach at St. Mary's School. What a great sign of stability and success! Another significant accomplishment is the completion of a written curriculum for all areas of our program. This process began three years ago and now we can enjoy the product of a coherent curriculum tailored for our school and featuring clear standards and outcomes.

Another new development is the expansion of our computer lab. We added 12 Pentium computers to our existing I-Macs. These Pentiums were a donation. Our computer lab now has a total of 24 computers, enough to fit an entire class at one time. We have internet connectivity for all computers and for every classroom. We created a new classroom in order to fit this growing laboratory and in order to expand our library.

Our French program continues to be very strong and provides our eighth grade graduates with the opportunity to take French II in High School. We also continue to offer Algebra I to our middle school students so that they have the opportunity to enter an advanced Algebra class once they graduate. For the second year in a row, we have a priest teaching religion to our middle school students. What a unique opportunity this is for our students. Thank you Father Ted and Father Sebastian for your dedication! We are so fortunate... so many blessings!

May God continue to bless all of our 138 students and their families. May God also bless all of the parishioners who support this great endeavor financially as well as with their prayers. Catholic Schools are proven to be the most effective vehicle to leave a legacy of our Faith. We thank the Lord every day for the existence of St. Mary's School!

I've listened to people talk about the attack on America and how everyone felt. I listened occasionally to the news coverage about the terrorist attack. The evening of Friday, September 14, I watched the Memorial Service held at the National Cathedral in Washington D.C. I started crying while I was listening to this service. Crying because of the senseless loss of so many lives. By the end of the memorial service, I was crying because of the joy I felt. At that service, there were many different religions represented. Many different religions that believe in the One True God. I felt total joy because God brought so many Christians together. I have never, in my lifetime, heard more people talk about praying than I did after the terrorist attack. Seeing so many heads of Government at this service, praying, singing and listening to God's Word together, made me think that maybe, just maybe, the division between Government and Religion will start to swing back to the way it was when the United States was formed. When the song "God Bless America" was written, when our National Anthem was written, "One Nation Under God," and when our currency was made "In God We Trust."
