It is with some regret that I say good-bye to the lazy days of sun ar. Though, one mother I met this weekend is throwing a big party the 1 rst day of school — it is for other parents!

Objectives for this year's program center heavily on the upper grades. I will try to state them as sumply as possible.

- 1. To provide for better catechist preparation and development among the area Junior High catechists.
 - adopt the same series for all parishes.
 - prepare lessons on the area level every 2 or 3 weeks.
 - make available weekly Scripture sharing for those who wish.
- To provide greater depth and balance in the Junior High curriculum for students.
 - into grade service projects and work for the poor into regular classes.
 - provide area/parish retreat and social experiences.
 - require greater accountability for material presented.
- To develop a strong pre- and post-Confirmation program. (1st semester grade 9. 1983)
 - seek adults and young adults especially suited for this sacrament and age level.
 - offer classes Wednesday afternoon and evening at St. Joseph's
 - utilize a large group presentation with discussion and activities held in small groups.
 - provide an area or parish retreat experience.
 - continue the policy that confirmandee must be attending class.
 - continue pastoral interviews and parent meetings.

The total budget for this year is \$81,860. In includes salaries for a director and h coordinators, a full time secretary and janitor as well the expenses of teaching supplies, textbooks and busing.

Assessments paid by the parishes total \$70,000 and are divided as follows:

St. Josephs ---St. Marys ---- \$25,130. Nativity ---- 9,100. \$24,220 St. Isaac Jogues -- 5,460 Sacred Heart --- 3,850 Blessed Kateri -- 2.240

This rate is figured by a formula which takes into consideration parish assessable income and the number of envelope users in a parish. It allows little parishes to have the same chance at quality religious education as their larger counterparts.
